

South Sixth Street Lights To Be Used This Week-End

Either tonight or tomorrow the power will be turned on the new S. 6th street highway lighting system. For three thousand feet along 6th, between Washburn way and Allamont drive, the south side of the street will be brightly illuminated.

Twenty high lighting poles, installed 145 to 160 feet apart and equipped with efficient and powerful lamps have been completed. Of this number 12 posts are the double type, with two lights on each pole, while eight of them have only one light apiece.

Although the lights will go on this week-end, the improvement will not

receive official recognition until either Friday or Saturday night next week. According to Ray Garrison, president of the South Sixth Street Improvement association, it has been tentatively planned to stage a street dance and some official doings at the ceremony next week. The reason for the delay was because the lights have to be tested before the terms of the contract have been met by the contractor.

Other highway and street lighting is planned for S. 6th street. It is hoped such improvement may be extended from the foot of the viaduct out as far as the main canal, ultimately to operate as a single unit. In this connection, it must be noted that the present units were installed by the Swan Lake Moulding company. In the future such capitalization will have to be subscribed to by residents and business people in the S. 6th area.

The present lighting is expected to be adequate for the south side of the street, but additional units will have to be installed to illuminate the north side. The lamps used are rated at 6000 lumen each, the equivalent of 300 watts, and the entire project will require a total of 10,800 watts of power.

The lighting was designed by state highway engineers. This particular type of installation is referred to as a white-way lighting system.

The size of the lamps and the spacing were designed to produce an even light intensity from one end of the lighted area to the other. Power supply cables were installed under the pavement and inside the fixtures so no wires would be visible. Electric service is supplied by CopCo and it is probable the company will buy the system. Actual power cost for the operation of the entire installation is expected to be under \$100 a month.

Dewey Still Holds Favor

SEATTLE, July 18 (AP)—Dewey, Taft and Vandenberg—with General MacArthur as a dark horse. That's the way James A. Farley, former postmaster general and national chairman of the democratic party, sees the republican presidential lineup for the '48 campaign.

Now "out of politics except as an interested and perhaps active American citizen," Farley gave his appraisal of the presidential race during a press conference last night following his arrival here on a business trip.

"It looks to me like Dewey, Taft and Vandenberg. And don't forget General MacArthur," he opined.

"If the opposition to Dewey throws in Taft and Vandenberg, and there's a deadlock, MacArthur may be it."

As for the democrats, Farley says it will be President Truman, "of course."

"And I want to see him win. I think he has done pretty well, considering the mess he stepped into."

Spray Stops Tussock Moths

LA GRANDE, July 18 (AP)—Results of aerial spraying of timber in Wallowa county's Troy area for tussock moth infestation were being checked today.

Miles Crompton, district forest warden, said the moths were traveling toward a large stand of virgin timber but it was believed the threat had been eliminated. In other areas spraying with DDT resulted in a 100 per cent kill, he said.

The infestation kills trees rapidly. He said that standing under one tree before the spraying it sounded "like a heavy rain," as twigs eaten off by larvae of the tussock moth fell to the ground.

Legislative Career Ends With Death

HILLSBORO, July 18 (AP)—Henry T. Hesse, 67, who served in four state legislative sessions as a Washington county representative, died here yesterday of a heart ailment.

Hesse was in the 1939, 1941, 1943 and 1945 sessions. He was reelected to a fifth term last year but resigned because of ill health.

A farmer near Schools, Ore., he had long taken a leading part in county affairs—a county commissioner from 1917 to 1921 and a school board clerk for 30 years.

The widow and a daughter survive.
