Conducting special services at the Klamath Temple, 1007 Pine, from July 23 to 27 will be Dr. Wilbur H. Pope, speaker, and Prof. and Mrs. Elbert T. Tindley, singers. The meetings are scheduled for each evening at 7:45 p. m., according to the Rev. D. B. Anderson.

Dr. Pope is the Oregon superintendent for the World Christian Fundamentals association. He will speak on the subject, "The Power of Eternal Life."

Professor Tindley, whose father was born a negro slave and became pastor of the largest Methodist church in the world, is a dramatic tenor. With him is his wife, who is a coloratura soprano. Professor Tindley will sing some of his father's well-known hymns. The speaker and singers appear here under the auspices of the World Christian Fundamentals association and an interdenominational group of Christian leaders.

Lunch will be served to the group followed by a program of varied content, the main event of which will be a talk by Steve Stone, drawn from his recent experience at the Westminster Fellowship national assembly at Grinnell, Ia. Barbara Zinn is chairman of the program committee. This meeting will take the place of the regular evening meeting for the seniors, but the intermediates will meet at the regular time, 6:30 p. m.

Barnett Named Synod Advisor

The Rev. David Barnett of the First Presbyterian church, 6th and Pine, was named as advisor for the Oregon Youth Synod Thursday, July 17. The Rev. Barnett became minister of the Klamath Falls church on July 30, 1944, after coming to Klamath Falls from Moneta, Calif.

The Oregon Youth Synod met in conjunction with the Presbyterian Synod of Oregon which convened at Corvallis this week. At the close of the 67th annual meeting, reports showed membership growth from 18,837 in 1919 to 22,736 this year. Next year's meeting will be held in Portland.

Portland Area Leader Named

DES MOINES, July 17 (AP)—Methodist Bishop Francis J. McConnell will assume administration of the 270 churches of the Portland area after receiving the appointment at the national meeting of the board of lay activities being held here. He will succeed the late Bishop Bruce R. Baxter.

Bishop McConnell, prior to his retirement in 1944, was for 16 years resident bishop of the New York area. The territory which he will supervise includes Idaho, Oregon, Washington and Alaska.

The appointment is effective immediately. Bishop McConnell will retain office until July, 1948, when the western jurisdictional conference will elect bishops and assign a successor.

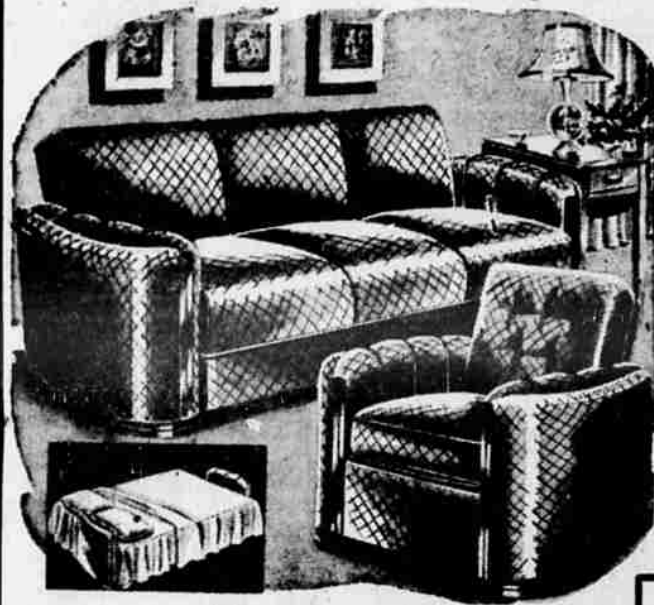

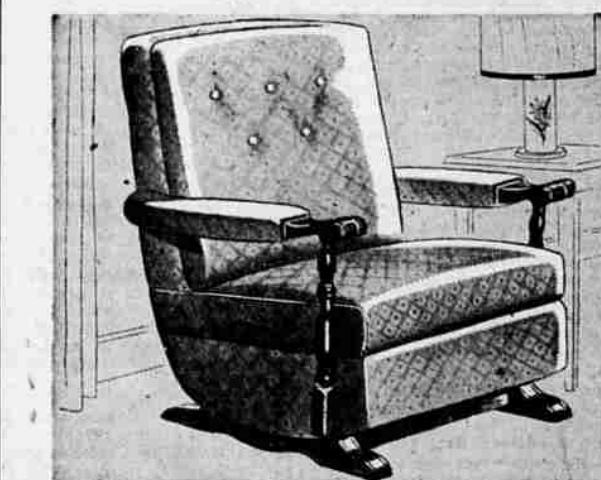

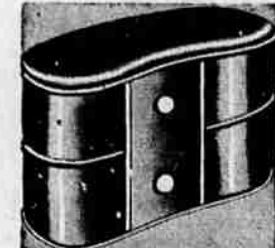
