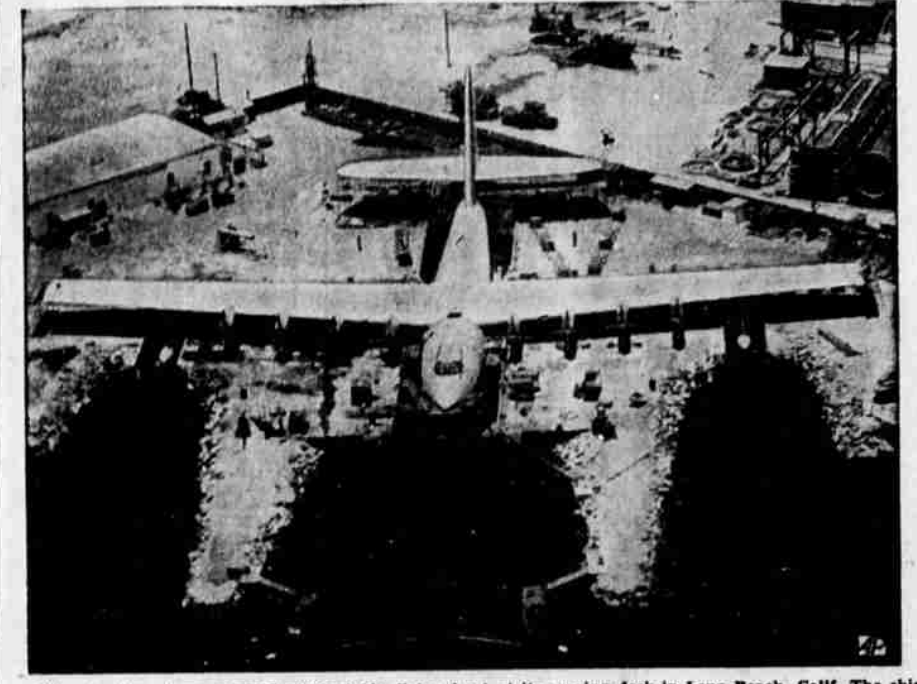

Three Dead Following Violence

JERUSALEM, July 21 (AP)—A dusk-to-dawn curfew was ordered today for 90,000 Jerusalem Jews, bringing to 155,000 the number of Jews under curfew restrictions here, in Haifa and in the Natanya area.
