

Council Okehs Playground On Old School Site

An outline of an elaborate recreation set-up to be located at the site of the old high school, 5th and High, was presented to the city council Monday night, with the city fathers putting a stamp of approval on the project.

Fred Robinson of the park-recreation board submitted the plan to the council. The playground, at an estimated cost of \$10,948.76, would include five separate play areas, or levels, each featuring different amusements, such as a picnic area, skating rink and wading pool, horse shoe pits, teeter-totters and slides for small children, and tennis, shuffle board and basketball courts. The committee hopes to have the levels providing activities for younger children constructed by the early summer of 1948.

Sam Smith, superintendent of recreation, assisted Robinson in giving details of the plan. Part of the property belongs to the county, and the park-recreation committee, was given authority by the council to contact county officials to negotiate for the land.

Council approval was given to a motion setting the time for a hearing on a resolution calling for construction of sewer unit No. 17, on the northeast side of S. 6th. Total cost is estimated at \$12,584.

Councilmen voted to delay approval of a resolution restricting parking on California and Congress avenues, awaiting a decision on whether or not the area will have bus service. The city dads approved a resolution limiting parking to the east side only of Pacific Terrace.

A maximum cost of \$1000 was set as the city's share on the cost of improving the roads in Moore park. The city and county will go half and half on the project, each paying \$1000.

The final reading of an ordinance authorizing construction of an improvement unit on Applegate from Mitchell to Washburn way was read by Police Judge Harold Franey, back from his vacation, and approved by the council.

Also read for the last time was an ordinance authorizing the placing of liens and assessments on property owners in the area on S. 7th from Oak to Willow and Plum avenues for improvements.

Local Demos See Truman As Candidate

The Klamath county democratic central committee, meeting last night, expressed its expectation that President Truman will be a candidate to succeed himself in November, 1948, and tentatively lined up to support the issues the president has created.

Local democrats feel that Truman's veto of the Taft-Hartley labor bill firmly placed that as one of the top 1948 election issues and his attitude toward helping war-torn countries has set up another, and the feeling is now that democrats here will go along with Truman on both issues at the next election.

There was some mention of Henry A. Wallace and a third party last night, but no very strong support for such a division was expressed.

That Truman will be the democratic candidate for president in 1948 is almost a foregone conclusion with local party members, although Truman himself has not announced his intentions. Since Truman is in his first term in the White House, and not a full term at that, the democratic party in all probability will nominate him to head its ticket without much ado at the national convention next spring.

SCHOOL HEAD NAMED
PORTLAND, July 22 (AP)—Portland school directors voted last night to invite Dr. Paul A. Rhenius, 46, superintendent of the Lakewood, O., schools to become superintendent here, succeeding Dr. Willard Spalding.
Formal action on the position is due later in the week on word of acceptance from Dr. Rhenius. He has been superintendent at Lakewood, a Cleveland suburb, since 1941 and is a graduate of the University of Michigan.

Driver's Licenses Numbered 5R-33,000 To 5R-66,000 Expire During July!

You must apply for renewal *this month ONLY* if your driver's license serial number is in the above group.

- No individual notice will be mailed to you.
- Do not apply by mail. Apply at the driver's license clerk or examiner in your community.
- No re-examination is required.

If your driver's license number is higher than 5R-66,000, get a renewal schedule from any service station, police or sheriff's office, or license clerk or examiner.

Oregon driver's licenses 5R-1 to 5R-33,000 are already invalid. Look at yours to make sure you are not violating the law.
