

South Sixth All Ready For Friday Evening Celebration

New Lights On Widened Street Prompt Affair

South Sixth street will be the scene of a celebration Friday night when recently installed street lights will illuminate the thoroughfare from Washburn way to Altamont drive. The lights have been given numerous trials this week by the California Oregon Power company, and all is in readiness to turn them on permanently.

The South Sixth Street Improvement association is sponsoring the celebration marking the official lighting, with a street dance to be held on the service runway along the street at a point just beyond the Tower theatre.

The official lighting ceremony will be broadcast over radio station KFLW from 8 to 8:30 p. m., immediately preceding the street dance.

Speaking on the broadcast will be numerous city, county and state officials, as well as other interested persons, including a representative of the Oregon state highway commission; A. D. Collier, South Sixth street businessman and head of Swan Lake Moulding company; Fred Hoagland, chairman of the city traffic safety council; County Judge U. E. Reeder, and Ray Garrison, president of the South Sixth Street Improvement association.

Adding to the festivities, free rides will be given to youngsters from 2:30 to 10 p. m. Friday on the miniature train operating on S. 6th, and from 7:30 to 9:30 p. m. free rides will be available on ponies to furnish amusement for children.

Ben Adair is general chairman of the arrangements for the celebration.

The street was recently widened and improved to a modern four-lane thoroughfare by the state highway department. The lighting project is the first of its kind to be set up in this area outside of organized municipalities.

Merchants and property owners in the area are discussing means of securing an additional lighting district to light the entire length of S. 6th.

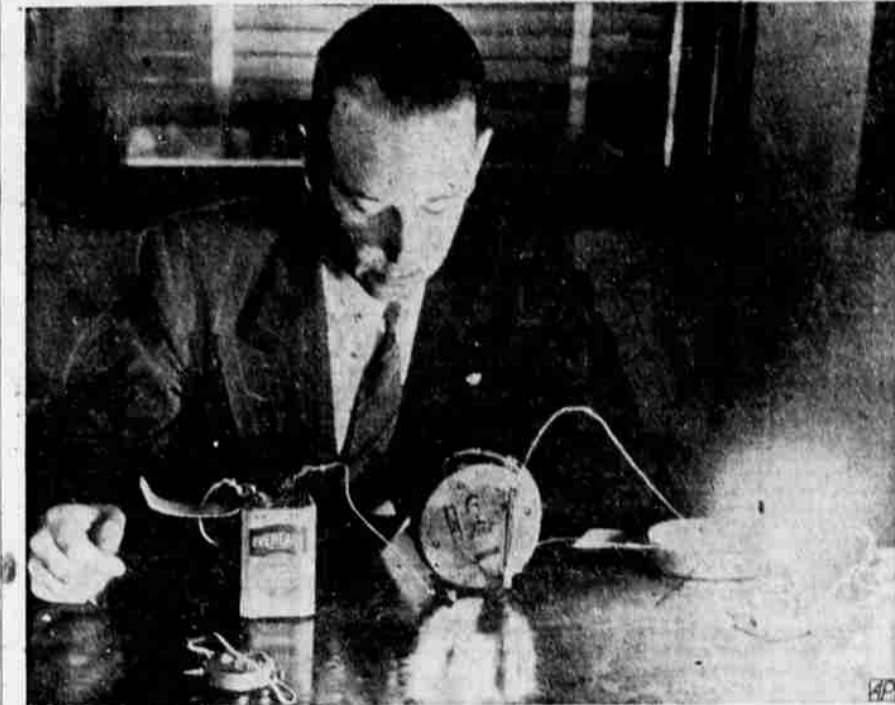

WHEREAS, the unregulated use of certain forest areas is, in my judgment, a menace to life and property due to an excessive amount of inflammable debris left on the ground by logging operations, windstorms, and fires in past years; and
WHEREAS, upon the showing of the State Forester, it appears to me to be necessary to close to unregulated use the following areas designated as:
AREA NO. 15-P—KLAMATH ASSOCIATION—Green Springs Area:
All lands in T₃ 39, 40 and 41, R₃ 4, S₃ and 6 E., between the Moon Prairie Road and Jenny Creek on the West and the Klamath River, and the S₃ of T₃ 38 S., R₃ 6 E., except the right of way

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARSHALL CORNETT, Governor of the State of Oregon, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the provisions of Section 107-210, Oregon Compiled Laws Annotated, as amended by Chapter 252, Oregon Laws, 1945, do hereby proclaim the unregulated use of the above described areas to be unlawful and that

said areas shall be subject to entry only through permit to be issued by the State Forester, or a fire warden, under which permit entrant shall comply with any and all of the following requirements:
(1) To refrain from smoking except in places designated as safe in said permit.
(2) To build no open fires except in places designated as safe in said permit, except when traveling as a pedestrian and/or camping at approved, designated, and posted campgrounds, tools as specified by the forester suitable for extinguishing fires.
This proclamation shall be effective from and after the 24th day of July, 1947, and shall remain in full force and effect until the 31st day of December, 1947.

Sales Tax Opponents Map Fight

Members of the state anti-sales tax committee met Monday afternoon at Oregon state grange headquarters in Portland determined to launch a campaign to prevent "foisting on the public of the most indefensible sales tax ever presented to the people of Oregon," according to State Representative Carl H. Francis of Dayton, chairman of the committee.

Spokenmen for the Oregon State Farmers' union, the Oregon State grange, the Oregon State Federation of Labor (AFL), the Oregon State CIO council and the public, members of the committee serve without compensation, with an office newly established at the grange headquarters, with one paid staff member in charge.

"Responding to many appeals from persons of modest incomes, our committee intends to fight this proposed sales tax right down the line," Francis declared. "Because we do represent people in the

smaller income brackets, we are handicapped by lack of funds, but this is offset by plenty of friends," he emphasized.

Francis termed the proposed sales tax "vicious, misleading, and a deliberate attempt to deceive the public."
