## Malay Federation Proposal Revised

LONDON, July 24 (AP)—Revised proposals for the establishment of a federation of Malaya, which would put nine Malay states and two British settlements under British protection, were announced in a white paper published today.

A new order in council, replacing the Malayan Union order in council of 1946, provides for the government of the British settlements of Penang and Malacca and give force to an agreement to be made with the rulers of Perak, Selangor, Negri Sembilan, Pahang, Johore, Kedah, Kelantan, Trengganu and Perlis.

## Gold Strike Excites Yreka

YREKA, Calif., July 24 (AP)—Northern California mining men awaited with interest today mill tests on gold ore discovered recently on George Noonan's property, which the Siskiyou Daily News said is believed to be of exceptionally high grade.

The property is under lease to Harry Thompson, San Francisco mining man, and associates. Thompson said the ore would be tested soon with a 10-ton pilot mill. He added that he did not want to make any estimate as to how much gold the ore would run to the ton.

The newspaper said, however, that Thompson's announcement of testing operations confirmed rumors of a discovery which had been circulating in Siskiyou county for the past several days. The paper said county mining men were predicting the ore would run "in the hundreds of dollars" a ton and "may prove to be the richest in the county's nearly 100-year-old mining history."

The man and woman were given 20 year terms by the Grants Pass circuit court several days ago after pleading guilty to assault with intent to kill Mary Jane Medlin, the 2-year-old "Miss X" who was found

beaten and abandoned at Weed June 15.
