Hot Seattle Squad Dumps Frisco; Has Series With Leader

The Pacific Coast league's hottest team at the moment, Seattle's Rainiers, got a whack at the leading Los Angeles Angels in a four-game series starting tonight.

The Rainiers and Angels made it two out of three in short series by winning last night from San Francisco and Portland, respectively, and will tee off on each other at Seattle for the rest of the week. The Rainiers are 10 games behind, in fourth place. This is their best chance to date to get closer.

Seattle pounded three Seal pitchers for 17 hits in slugging out a 10-inning 6-2 decision. Don White started the scoring with a homer for the Seals, but the Rainiers came back with circuit smashes by Hollie Hensley, Lou Novikoff and Mickey Tocco. Hensley's double and John O'Neill's single accounted for the winning run.

The Angels breezed to a 6-2 win over the Beavers on Red Lynn's five-hit job. The league leaders touched Roy Helder for 12 blows, including Eddie Malone's homer. Helder drove one over the fence.

Los Angeles' lead stretched to five games as the second-place Oakland A's fell 7-3, before Sacramento. Ken Holcombe let the Oaks down with six hits. Joe Marty's two-run homer paced an 11-hit Solon attack on Dewey Soriano. The Sox nailed the series, 2-1.

Hollywood's Stars got a rarity—for them—a full-length four-hitter by Joe Krakauskas. The southpaw edged Tom Seaver in stopping San Diego, 2-1.

MINNEAPOLIS, July 25 (AP)—Three golfers who never before won more than a bottle of pop as a side bet and a former New England champion met today in the 36-hole semi-finals of the national public links tournament at the Meadowbrook course.

Late Season Opposition Not Formed

PORTLAND, Ore., July 25 (AP)—Expected opposition had not appeared yet today to an Oregon state fish commission proposal to set the commercial fishing season on silver-side salmon back a month from the usual May opening.

The commission, attempting to achieve fish conservation and yet keep fishermen in business, suggested future seasons last from June 15 to November 1 with a minimum length of 25 inches for the fish. The public and Washington state fisheries officials raised no objection in a public hearing yesterday.

Biologists said the heavy catch of silversides usually began in May, but that the postponement would mean bigger fish, since silvers grow rapidly.

The commission also proposed a minimum length of 28 inches for chinooks, but said it was not ready to propose seasonal limits.
