Some Stock Leaders Slip

NEW YORK, Aug. 1 (AP)—Selected stocks continued to make headway in today's market although many leaders slipped and dealers were among the slowest of the past month.

A few spots of strength were in evidence at the close but narrow irregularity was the rule. Transfers held bid to around 800,000 shares. Coca-Cola, an exceptionally "thin" stock, jumped 9 points to 188, a peak for the year, on limited transfers.

General Motors and Chrysler pushed up briefly when the former

announced a price hoist for its cars. GM closed up 1/4 and Chrysler was off 1/2.

Better performers included Youngtown Sheet, International Harvester, Deere, Grumman Aircraft, American Smelting, Du Pont, Union Carbide, Johns-Manville, U. S. Gypsum, Owens-Illinois, American Chicle (on a pleasing disbursement), Texas Co. and Joy Mfg.

Bonds were uneven. Cotton, toward the finish, was off 70 cents to up 15 cents a bale. At Chicago wheat ended unchanged to down 1/2 cent a bushel, corn off 1/4 to up 1/2 cent and oats up 1/4 to 1/2 cent.
