YMCA Starts Tumbling Class

Tumbling classes for young boys and badminton classes for several ages are being conducted by the local YMCA, as a start in their recreation program for the city.

Boys from eight to 10 may receive tumbling instruction from a qualified instructor from 10:30 a. m. to 11 a. m., and boys aged 10 to 13 may attend a class from 11 a. m. to noon.

Badminton classes for men and women 18 and over are conducted on Monday evenings and sessions for boys and girls, 13 to 18, meet on Wednesday night. Both age groups meet at the YMCA headquarters in the armory at 8 p. m., on their appointed nights.

YMCA officials are expecting to open the headquarters for teenagers sometime next week, if present plans work out. Any group wanting to use Y facilities should contact the YMCA office to make arrangements.

The headquarters are open during the day from 10 a. m. on, and anyone desiring may drop in to use facilities. Ping-pong tables have been set up and shuffleboard boundaries have been marked out and these games may be played any time during the day. A juke box is also at the disposal of visitors.
