

Odell Lake Association Formed For Purpose Of Improving That Vicinity

CASCADE SUMMIT, Aug. 1—A meeting was held at Odell Summit lodge Sunday for the purpose of forming an association to be known as Odell Lake association. This association is planned in order to obtain certain improvements for Odell lake and immediate vicinity.

The following officers were chosen: J. E. Badley, president; E. V. Adkinson, vice president; Florence Adkinson, secretary-treasurer; F. C. Purkypille, director; F. A. Moody, director. Fourteen were present at the meeting.

The first objective outlined for the association was the improvement of fishing conditions in the

lake, the increased stocking and the protection of the present fish population. All possible ideas were discussed and on motion of Howard, seconded by Caswell, the officers were instructed to negotiate and pursue the necessary steps to accomplish the following four primary objectives with the authorities of state, government and other bodies:

1. Stop poisoning the fish now in Odell lake.
2. Increase on a regular schedule the stocking of legal sized fish in the lake.
3. To close spawning areas during the proper season and insist that some practical patrol and method of enforcing of such restriction be implemented.
4. Investigate the desirability and practicability of stocking Odell lake with Kamloops trout.

One Killed In Crash Of Army Plane

MCHORD FIELD, Wash., Aug. 1 (AP)—One man was killed and two of three others on a B-25 bomber bailed out early today after the plane caught fire and crashed east of Kelso, Wash., on a night flight south to Hamilton Field, Calif.

Searching state patrol and police officers found the partly-burned wreckage after daybreak one mile east of the Goble creek bridge, eight miles east of Kelso. One body lay in the wreckage. A. V. Clark, Longview police chief, reported. The fourth man remained unaccounted for early in the forenoon.

Dropped Flare

The plane, in trouble shortly after leaving here at 2 a. m., dropped a flare over the Longview area and was then seen with one engine afire, the Cowlitz county sheriff's office reported. The crash occurred about 2:30 a. m.

The plane's crew chief, Tech. Sgt. (1st name Unavb) Matthews, was critically injured in his parachute jump and brought to the Cowlitz General Hospital, Longview.

Sgt. Elmer L. Taft, Fort Lawton, Wash., parachuted over Rose valley, several miles from the crash scene, awakened persons in a house 200 yards away and then got a ride into Kelso. He was on furlough and was making his first airplane flight, he said.

"They hung a chute on me, told me what to do and then shoved me out of the plane," he told newsmen.

The two men leaped from approximately 1000 feet altitude. The plane was attached to Hamilton field.

PORTLAND, Aug. 1 (AP)—A price of \$2.14 a bushel for No. 2 soft white wheat at Portland will be the base for federal crop insurance premium payments in Oregon.

The state federal crop insurance corporation said that each county would have differentials from the Portland price. The deadline for payments by growers will be September 30.

ord its previous action stopping his salary as delegate.

That request was not voted upon.

Jackson Makes Appeal

Boyd Jackson, leader of the faction opposing Crawford, took up the talk on SB 1222, urging that the tribe get together to oppose liquidation.

"The Klamath reservation is our heritage," Jackson said. "It's the goose that lays the golden egg. Don't be greedy and kill the goose."

Jackson said that there were forces already on the reservation that were trying to dissolve the Indian holdings, white men who have the best lands and "want the milk as well as the cream."

He also asserted that Crawford, a little over 10 years ago, was against "turning the Indians loose," and had said that if the Klamaths were turned loose they'd be fleeced of everything they have overnight.

Crawford talked for 25 minutes.

Wants Bill Discussion

With both sides having had an inning, Seldon Kirk was about to call for a vote when Crawford stood up to say that he didn't want to see the matter "railroaded" through the council.

Kirk said he "never heard it." The Indians were being made to take their business committee's word for what SB 1222 would do and he wanted the measure read before the council section by section and discussed before a vote.

Kirk again started to call a vote and Crawford jumped up again to say that he wanted the record to show his motion was being ignored.

Kirk said he "never heard it." About that time Mrs. Seldon Kirk, back in the audience, got the floor to plead with the factions to get together in the serious business without so much bickering. She also demanded to know what the attorney in Washington the Klamaths are paying \$4000 a year was doing now that the Indians needed his advice. Dice Crane informed her the attorney would be here for the hearing.
