

Britain, US Speeding Up Coal Output

WASHINGTON, Aug. 4 (AP)—The United States and Britain, embarking on a new phase of the postwar "battle of the Ruhr," are shooting at a one-third increase in German coal output by year's end as a major contribution to the Marshall plan.

With Europe's economic recovery intimately involved, production now is running about 220,000 tons a day, only half the peak reached when Hitler's war machine was rolling at full speed.

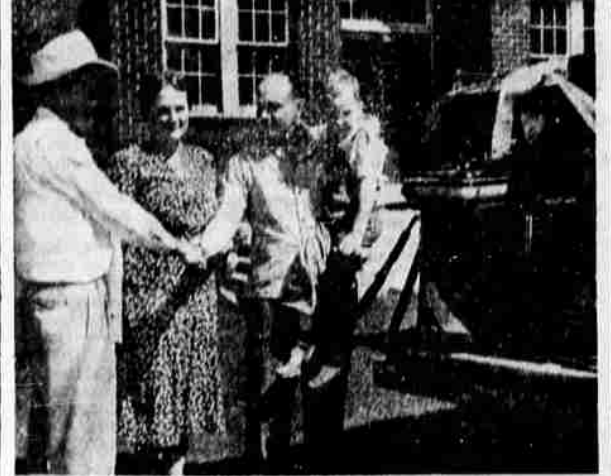
The official hope is that the tonnage can be stepped up to 300,000 in December, followed by further gains to 350,000 or more daily.

Diplomatic authorities who outlined these aims today, along with some of the headlines in trying to solve one of Europe's most important recovery problems, are cautiously optimistic that the approaching huddle of Anglo-American experts here will give new impetus to the gradual gains made since V-E Day.

Exactly when the talk will start remains in doubt. Presumably, however, Prime Minister Attlee's report to parliament Wednesday on Britain's economic plight will clear the way for his country's representatives to be on their way.

The formal conversations already have been delayed several times while Washington and London argued over just what should be taken up.

Vet's Mail Bag

As a service to veterans in the community, this newspaper will publish an occasional column of questions most frequently asked contact men of the Veterans Administration in this area. For more detailed information, veterans should contact or write to the nearest VA contact unit at Klamath Falls, Oregon.

Veterans administration today answered the 10 questions most frequently asked by World War II veterans about National Service Life Insurance in a recent VA survey. The questions and answers follow:

Q. How can a GI policy offer so many advantages for so low a premium?

A. Because the government assumes all costs of administration and of extra hazards due to military and naval service. Also, there is no extra charge calculated in the premium for those engaged in hazardous occupations, or for the waiver of premiums in case of total disability for six consecutive months or more.

Q. When will I start getting dividends on my NSLI?

A. Dividends will be paid as soon as the administrative work of determining the amount due each participant can be accomplished.

Q. When will I receive a regular insurance policy instead of my certificate?

A. Policy forms are being drafted to include changes made necessary by recent insurance legislation designed to make NSLI life insurance needs of veterans. They will be distributed when the VA branch offices can handle the extra work without interfering with their primary purpose of giving service to those who are keeping their insurance in force.

Q. Why do I have to pay two monthly premiums when I reinstate my lapsed policy?

A. One premium is for the 31-day grace period following the date of lapse, during which the insurance was continued in force without payment of premium; the other premium is for the current month of the reinstatement.

Q. What is the difference between term insurance and converted insurance?

A. Term insurance provides the same protection for a specific period to the insured's beneficiaries in the event of death, as does converted insurance. However, term insurance accrues no cash, loan or paid-up insurance values, as do the permanent, life and endowment plans.

Q. Can I choose anyone I wish to be my beneficiary?

A. Yes. There is no restriction in your choice of a beneficiary.

Q. Can I use part of my armed forces leave bond to pay my insurance and receive the remainder in cash?

A. No. The remainder of your bond is placed to your credit until such time as it becomes payable in cash, or you authorize further pre-

Flour Workers Back On Jobs

BUFFALO, N. Y., Aug. 4 (AP)—Production was resumed today in the largest flour milling center in the U. S. as approximately 2600 millers returned to work, ending a three-week strike.

Settlement of the walkout, that nearly halted production, came yesterday in a surprise conference called by O. S. Rider of the U. S. conciliation service. Officials of the five struck mills and Stanley J. Bauer, business agent of local 212, AFL Flour Mill Workers, agreed on a one-year contract, retroactive to July 1, including:

A general 15-cent hourly wage hike with five cents extra for top maintenance men.

Six paid holidays.

Inclusion of holiday time in computation of overtime pay. The union sought a 15 per cent pay over the hourly average of \$1.14.

Northwest To Get Highways

WASHINGTON, Aug. 4 (AP)—Two branches of the proposed super-network of interstate highways designated by the public roads administration will run through the Pacific Northwest, it was indicated today.

One of the north-south arteries will extend from Bellingham, Wash., down the coast to San Diego, while an east-west highway will run from Seattle through Spokane, Butte, Billings, Rapid City and Sioux Falls, or Bismarck and Minneapolis to Milwaukee, Wis.

The program, approved by Federal Works Administrator Philip B. Fleming, was submitted largely by state highway departments after conferences between state and federal road officials to settle differences over alternate routes and connections at state boundaries.

Some construction already has started, but completion dates are indefinite. Estimates on completion range up to 15 years.

BERLIN, Aug. 4 (AP)—Gen. Lucius D. Clay reports that Germans roving the countryside in quest of food for the coming winter have fought gun battles with German police assigned to guard crops in the American zone.

Clay's semi-monthly report to Washington said that seven such affrays had occurred in Hesse during the last two weeks of July and that in Wuertemberg-Baden more than 400 pillagers had overwhelmed a small German police force guarding potato harvesters.
