

British Arrest Mayors Of Holy Land Towns In Move To End Terrorism

JERUSALEM, Aug. 5 (AP)—The British arrested the mayors of the Jewish town of Tel Aviv, Ramat Gan, Natanya and Petah Tikva (Tikvah) and jailed dozens of other Jewish political leaders in dawn raids described officially as "part of the campaign against terrorism." But violence continued.

A labor department building in the street of the prophets was destroyed by a bomb which killed a British policeman trying to remove the explosive. Two other officers were injured. British troops investigated the debris, from which were traced a mushrooming smoke cloud.

The new law will continue support prices on domestic wool at the 1946 level until December 31, 1948. Payments to wool growers will be made by the commodity credit corporation.

Tufts Files Damage Suit

J. A. Tufts of Tufts Furnace company has filed a lawsuit against Mr. and Mrs. George Ralph Utley growing out of an automobile accident May 20 at Division and Reclamation streets.

Mrs. Utley was driving a car which collided with a panel truck owned by the furnace company and driven by an employe, Vernon Wallace. The panel truck was damaged in the extent of \$1325.50, according to the complaint, and Tufts is asking a judgment for that figure plus \$15 a day for the loss of the truck since May 20.

The complaint charges that Mrs. Utley was speeding and driving recklessly at the time of the accident and did not yield the right-of-way to the truck. E. E. Driscoll is attorney for Tufts.

Engineer Killed By Own Engine

OSWEGO, N. Y., Aug. 5 (AP)—A 57-year-old railroad engineer was killed today when he was run over by his own engine in a tunnel of the Delaware, Lackawanna and Western railroad.

Police reported that John Carroll, Syracuse, was attempting to escape from the cab of the locomotive as steam started pouring from a valve and fell under the moving engine.

Lightning-Set Fires Held Down
SPOKANE, Aug. 5 (AP)—Only six of the Inland Empire's 150 lightning-set forest fires exceeded a quarter acre and all were brought under control yesterday, Don Williamson, manager of the forest service warehouse reported.

Many of the blazes were snuffed out by smoke jumpers who parachuted into otherwise inaccessible timber regions.

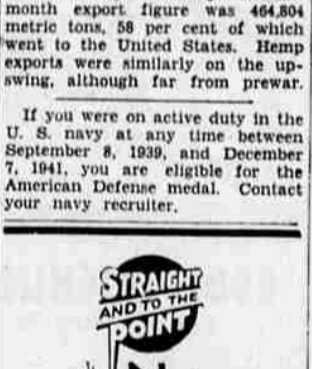
Copra Shipments More Than Double

MANILA, Aug. 5 (AP)—The export of copra, prime commodity of the Philippines, in the first half of 1947 more than doubled that for the same period last year, government economists reported today. The six-month export figure was 464,804 metric tons, 58 per cent of which went to the United States. Hemp exports were similarly on the upswing, although far from prewar.

Oregon Lamb Crop Far Below Average

PORTLAND, Aug. 5 (AP)—Oregon's 1947 lamb crop was the smallest in the past 23 years of government records, the federal crop reporting service said today.

The crop of 643,000 was 8 per cent below 1946 and 44 per cent under the 10-year average.

The drop was attributed to the marketing of ewe lambs during high price periods last summer and fall.
