

Tionesta Resident Found Guilty Of Obstructing Glass Mountain Road

TULELAKE, Aug. 6—Henry Tree, 60, of Tionesta, for 40 years a resident of Modoc county, Calif., and Klamath Falls, was found guilty yesterday of obstructing a public road. Tree had strung a half-inch steel cable across a forest service road on Glass Mountain.

The man has several pumice blains and a pumice brick plant on Glass Mountain, and on May 10 he was arrested by California Highway Patrolman Gerald Wilson after Wilson discovered the cable blocking off the road. The cable was about four and a half feet off the ground.

Tree claimed he built the road and could close it off if he wanted. Testimony at the trial indicated that the road was built by the Shaw Lumber company and given to the U. S. forest service in 1941.

Trial was slated for last May, but at that time Tree said that he did not have time to prepare his defense. He pleaded not guilty.

Yesterday, before Justice of the Peace W. R. Loudon of Stronghold, Tree was represented by Attorneys U. S. Balentine and R. F. McLaren, both of Klamath Falls. After the trial the 12-man jury voted 11 to 1 for conviction and Judge Loudon sent the jurors back for more deliberations. An hour later a unanimous verdict of guilty was returned.

Sentence was not passed immediately. Tree is liable to a fine of \$500, six months in jail or both.

Officer Wilson said that since 1944 he had made over 900 arrests in Siskiyou and Modoc counties, and Tree was the first person to plead not guilty and request a jury trial.
