

Slight Drop Predicted In Meat Prices

WASHINGTON, Aug. 7 (AP)—Here is the way the agriculture department expects prices and supplies of major farm and food products to stack up during the next few months:

Meat and livestock—a seasonal decline expected in fall, but the amount will be "only moderate" if consumer incomes stay high.

Feed grains—the weather remains important to price prospects for corn and other feed grains. If it's favorable through the remainder of the growing season, prices probably will decline this fall and winter, but may average higher than last year.

Dairy products—further increases expected during fall and winter, but they are unlikely to reach levels of a year ago after ceilings were removed.

Eggs—A less-than-usual increase expected this fall.

Wheat—Prospects for a small corn crop are tending to strengthen prices despite record wheat crop.

Fats and oils—larger production forecast.

Fruits and vegetables—growers' fruit prices this summer expected to continue below last year. Fruit production will be larger. A more rapid decline than usual is expected in prices of most commercial truck crops grown for the fresh market this summer.

Potato prices will average higher than last year for the next few months.

The former Nina Maude Willgrass of Norwich, England, wife of an American air forces veteran, took off late yesterday for Frankfurt, Germany, accompanied by her husband, Charles Billie Delcours, 23, Magnolia, Tex., sawmill worker, and their four-month-old daughter, Carol.

Acting on the advice of physicians that his wife would be "happier" at her Norwich home, Delcours induced her to make the trip on the pretext her father had obtained a job for her there.

Physicians decreed she should not be told the nature of her illness. They said she is suffering from cancer.

Sailors Hit Labor Bill

SEATTLE, Aug. 7 (AP)—Ed Coester, Seattle business agent for the Sailors Union of the Pacific, said yesterday that both the SUP and the affiliated Seafarers' International union, are prepared to "go the limit" in challenging anti-closed shop provisions of the Taft-Hartley labor law.

Coester said the "showdown" would come in negotiations for new contracts which expire September 30.

The action was decided upon, he said, by the locals' approval of a resolution opposing any change in the present hiring hall system of dispatching men to ships on a rotation basis. The resolution was

Scouts Slate Water Meet

Boy Scouts headquarters announced today the events which will be staged at the coming Klamath basin swimming meet, to be held at the Klamath Union high school stadium on August 14. The following contests will be held, under the direction of Earl Graham, waterfront director at Camp Makalla.

A candle race—contestants will swim a lap without extinguishing the candle. An egg and spoon race—one lap with spoon and egg in mouth. A towel race—one lap carrying towel in any manner possible. Sailboat race—each contestant must blow sailboat to finish line (non-swimmers only). Penny dive—contestants dive from surface of water for pennies thrown into medium deep water. 50-yard free style swim—two lap race. Disobedient relay race—team style relay with added difficulty of having to take off clothes before swimming. Swim and submerge race—contestants swim until whistle blows, then submerge until it blows again, then swim again, etc.

The announcement stressed that, in general, events will be limited to one contestant per troop, or one team per troop if it's a relay.

Import Cut Not To Effect Lumber

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 7 (AP)—A proposed reduction of lumber imports by Britain will not affect current contracts in the Pacific Northwest.

This was the assertion today by James McDonald, British consul just returned from England. He said only future buying would be affected. Lumber industry representatives said current contracts call for 300,000,000 board feet of lumber for

Britain from the northwest and about 800,000,000 from Canada. They estimated the 40,000,000 cut would mean a drop of 10 per cent in northwest exports if the reduction is applied proportionately to U. S. and Canada.
