

# Collier Explains County Road Benefits In New California Highway Act

TULELAKE, Calif., Aug. 7—California's new state highway law gives the Tulelake area what it wanted, but failed to get, in the road administration features of the recently defeated Siskiyou county charter, Senator Randolph Collier told the Tulelake Rotary club at a luncheon meeting Wednesday.

Collier, leader in the two-year fight for the sweeping highway legislation adopted at the recent session of the legislature, declared that the measure goes farther than any previous bill to give the "cow counties" fair treatment on highway matters.

Recalling the things Tulelake people had fought for in the recent county charter contest, he said that the new law makes provision for county road administration that embraces virtually the same features as sought in the charter, such as centralization of control and equipment use. "So you won on that angle, after all," he told the Tulelakers.

The law provides that the county board of supervisors must appoint a road engineer to administer highway affairs in the county. The state law provides for a flat gift of \$20,000 to the county to set up its road administrative offices. The board of supervisors must classify all roads in the county as primary or secondary, and state assistance will be provided for development of the primary roads. In the first full year of operation under the law, he said, Siskiyou county will get \$400,000, and in three to five years you should have some fine roads in the Tulelake area.

As for the city of Tulelake, the senator said that it will get four times as much from the state gas tax as it has received in any previous year.

On state highways, Collier said that critical deficiencies will govern the early construction work, and that the Weed-Klamath Falls highway (1267) will receive two major jobs, one through the Dorris area and the other on the Weed end. State highway construction as a whole will receive three times as much money as it would get without the new law.

Senator Collier told the Rotarians that it was necessary to take a broad statewide viewpoint of high-

## Chinese Army Defeats Reds

NANKING, Aug. 7 (AP)—Air-supported government troops in Western Shantung province forced units of red Gen. Liu Po-cheng's army back against the flood-swollen Yellow river today while government forces in Eastern Shantung increased pressure along the Tsing-tso-Tsinan railway.

Military observers said government commanders had every opportunity to inflict a major defeat on the communists in the west because the Yellow river was now five miles wide and few boats were available. Liu's army invaded Western Shantung from neighboring Hopei province several weeks ago in an effort to reinforce the reds' Shantung armies.

In Eastern Shantung government assault troops moved in to attack Kiaohsien, 45 miles northwest of Tsingtao. Dispatches said other government forces captured Yitu, 50 miles northwest of Kiaohsien and were pushing northwest to attack Lintzu, 16 miles away.

The dispatches added that communists in the Poshan coal mining region southwest of Yitu were showing signs of retreat.

A semi-official source in Hanking said Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek and his personal chief of staff, Gen. Yu Chi-shih, flew to Yenian today to confer with Gen. Hu Chung-nan on strengthening government defenses in Northwest China.

## Washington Sets Pheasant Season

SEATTLE, Aug. 7 (AP)—The Chinese pheasant hunting season in Washington will be from October 12 to 29, with a daily limit of three roosters, a possession limit of 15 and a season limit of 15, governed, as last year, by a punch-card system.

The fall hunting seasons were confirmed by the five-man state game commission at a special session here yesterday.

## Price Of Bread Up In Portland

PORTLAND, Aug. 7 (AP)—The price of bread went up a cent a loaf in many Portland bakeries today, for the first time since March 13.

The increase was not uniform—some bakeries charging the extra cent only for certain types of bread, and one still retaining former prices. Bakers blamed higher labor and flour costs.

He was charged June 4 with illegal possession of a government check stolen from the mails. His 21-year-

old wife, mother of a four-year-old girl, tried to lead officers to his hiding place yesterday. Later, she appealed through newspapers for him to surrender.
