MIAMI, Fla., Aug. 9 (AP)—Virginia Hill, tempestuous, black-haired girl friend of slain gambler Benjamin (Bugsy) Siegel, arrived at Miami airport from New York and Paris today and was taken in a police patrol car to her home at Sunset island.

Miss Hill was met by Detective Bill Murray and Officer Wayne Miller of the Miami Beach police.

She refused to answer questions from newsmen.

"I'm not talking to you reporters," she said. "I have absolutely nothing to say to any of you. You Americans started all this anyway."

When newsmen persisted, she spat out: "I have nothing to say. Don't you understand English."

Imperial Army Officer Dies

ANN ARBOR, Mich., Aug. 9 (AP)—Gen. Anton Denikine, 76, former Imperial Russian army officer who later led White Russian forces in a futile three-year struggle against the Bolsheviks, died of a heart attack Thursday night in the University of Michigan hospital.

He was taken ill 10 days ago while visiting with his wife, Xenia, at the summer home of a friend, Hilarion Bibicoff, who lives at nearby Dexter.

Exiled from his native land since 1920, when he fled to Istanbul after defeat of his White forces, Gen. Denikine found refuge in France, where he lived until coming to the United States slightly more than a year ago.

His body will remain in American soil. Funeral services were set for Monday, with burial at Evergreen cemetery in Detroit.

Navy Fleet Unloads At Pt. Barrow

BARROW, Alaska, Aug. 9 (AP)—The largest supply fleet in the history of the American Arctic was off shore Point Barrow, the northernmost point of the continent, today discharging 20,000 tons of cargo.

Ranging from paper clips to giant cranes, the cargo comprises the year's equipment and provisions for the oil exploration force on the navy's 35,000 square mile petroleum reserve No. 4.

The fleet of four freighters and an LST was conveyed by two navy bombers, flying ice patrol, and the ice breaker Burton Island as it groped in fog through the narrow channel between the Polar ice cap and the Arctic coast line yesterday to arrive off Barrow on the sunniest day of the year.

Assault-type barges started speeding ashore the cargo at a pace of 20 tons an hour. Capt. Byron S.

Anderson of Coronado, Calif., commander of the expedition which left Seattle July 31, estimated the unloading would require a week of rush work. He said he was anxious to complete it earlier if possible to avoid the risk of a shift in the wind which might send shoreward the menacing icebergs, which are visible from the beach. The annual Arctic expedition is regarded as one of the most hazardous shipping runs in existence. A two-week period is normally the only safe span for running the gauntlet of the treacherous ice cap.

Arrival of the ships is the brightest moment of the year for the region's 375 civilian contractors' employees on the navy reserve and the 600 Eskimos who receive the year's requirements to supplement the natives' whale, walrus and ivory economy.

THURMONT, Md., Aug. 9 (AP)—President Truman took it easy today as he and Mrs. Truman enjoyed the cool of their nearby Catocin mountain retreat.

The president, his work finished on 194 bills sent up to him in the closing days of congress, hiked, swam and read as part of a week-end devoted to relaxation.

He drove to this park area, 65 miles northwest of Washington, yesterday, accompanied by Mrs. Truman and a secret service detachment.

None of his official staff came along.

The president said he does not plan to leave the Catocin park area until he returns to Washington Monday.

No visitors, official or social, were expected and newsmen were not invited into the park area which includes "Shangri-la," a former CCC camp.

"Shangri-la" once was surrounded by mystery. It was taken over by the navy originally as a wartime hideaway for the late President Roosevelt.

Its chief attractions for Mr. Truman are rustic trails where he likes to walk—his favorite sport—and its outdoor swimming pool.

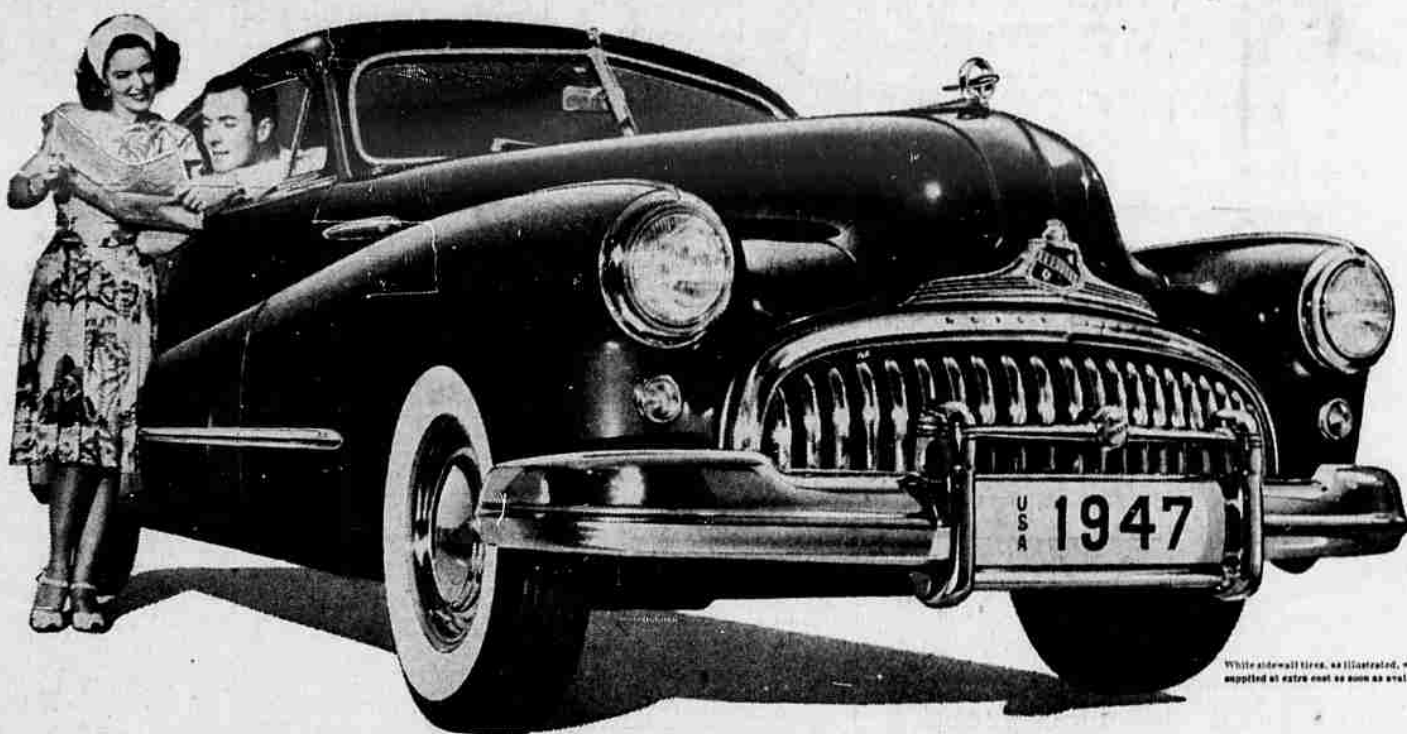
