

Recreation Lead Tells Of Progress

Sam Smith, Klamath Falls city recreation director, reported good progress in describing the work of his department before the Klamath Falls Rotary club, at the regular weekly meeting at the Willard hotel Friday, August 8.

"Our first problem," he said, "was to quickly analyze the available facilities, then to get them into the most possible use as soon as possible. First priority, of course, was recreation for the children, after which we gave as much attention to adult activities as we could. Thus this season," Mr. Smith continued, "over 39,000 hours of supervised recreation have been provided for the children alone."

Looking to the future, Smith outlined the three big objectives of the city's recreation department as, first, reclamation of playgrounds and recreation areas throughout Klamath Falls; second, location and improvement of an adequate softball and baseball park complete with lighting; and third, the construction of a central swimming facility of efficient size and design to accommodate all who wish to enjoy modern water recreation.

In closing, Smith expressed appreciation for the cooperation his department has received, describing the assistance as very gratifying and extremely important.

RESOLUTION NO. 765
A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KLAMATH FALLS, OREGON, TO CONSTRUCT AND LAY SEWERS, IN THAT PORTION OF PRECINCT NO. 33 LYING TO THE NORTHEAST OF SOUTH SIXTH STREET, APPROVING PLANS, SPECIFICATIONS AND ESTIMATES THEREFOR FILED BY THE CITY ENGINEER, DESCRIBING THE BOUNDARIES OF PROPERTY HEREIN FILED, AND DIRECTING CERTAIN STEPS TO BE TAKEN SAID PROJECT TO BE KNOWN AS SEWER UNIT NO. 17.

The City Engineer of the City of Klamath Falls pursuant to a resolution of the

Common Council heretofore adopted, having filed plans, specifications and estimates for the cost of constructing and laying what is to be known as the 17th sewer unit of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, located in that portion of Precinct No. 33, lying to the northeast of South Sixth Street, embracing in said unit all of the property hereinafter bounded and described; and the Common Council having taken said plans, specifications and estimates under consideration, and finding the same satisfactory.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KLAMATH FALLS, OREGON, DULY ASSEMBLED IN REGULAR SESSION AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I
That the plans, specifications and estimates for the construction and installation of what is to be known as the 17th sewer unit of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, shall be and is hereby approved and adopted.

SECTION II
That the Common Council of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, hereby declares its intention to construct and lay the 17th Sewer Unit of said City in accordance with the said plans, specifications and estimates; that the project of constructing separate pipe sewers, together with all necessary manholes, lamp-holes, Y's, branches and necessary appurtenances for a complete sewer system located in that portion of Precinct No. 33, lying to the northeast of South Sixth Street in Klamath Falls, Oregon, by placing therein vitrified sewer pipes with Y's, manholes, lamp-holes and the like or concrete sewer pipe made according to the specifications for concrete sewer pipes all as more fully shown by the plans and specifications on file with the Police Judge of said City, at a total estimated cost as follows, to-wit:

SECTION III
That the property lying within the boundaries hereinafter described, shall be and is hereby declared to be benefited by the construction and installation of said sewer system, to-wit:

SECTION IV
Beginning at the intersection of the south line of Shasta Way and the west line of Washburn Way in the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon; thence west along the south line of Shasta Way to the northeast line of South 6th Street; thence southeast along South 6th Street to the west line of Washburn Way; thence north along Washburn Way to the point of beginning.

Said real property above described lying in Klamath Falls, Klamath County, Oregon, shall be and is hereby declared to be benefited and assessed for the expense of said sewer unit.

That Monday the 25th day of August, 1947, at the hour of 7:30 p. m. o'clock thereof, in the Council Chamber in the City Hall of Klamath Falls, Oregon, shall be and is hereby fixed as the time and place for hearing objections or remonstrances against the construction and installation of the said 17th sewer unit.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT THE Police Judge of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, be and he is hereby authorized and directed to cause a notice of said hearing to be published as provided by the City Charter and conforming thereto; he shall cause this resolution to be published in the city official newspaper, once a day for ten consecutive days and the City Engineer, be and he is hereby directed to post, within five days after the first publication of this
