

Shuck Brothers Distributors

Shuck Brothers, Merrill, will be exclusive distributors in Klamath and Lake counties for two brands of beer, Budweiser and Ekborn. Arrangements were completed over the week-end for the Budweiser agency with the arrival of a district representative of Anheuser-Busch company.

Budweiser is returning to the West coast after a four years absence due to transportation shortages during the war.

Ekborn is an Oregon product and the majority of proceeds from this beverage go into Oregon business channels. The William Roesch Brewing company, Pendleton, is owned and operated by Oregon men. H. E. Choupek is manager.

New trucks will be operated by the local distributors to assure prompt and efficient delivery service. Much of this responsibility will be given to W. W. Baldwin, long time resident of Klamath county, now affiliated with Shuck Brothers and to Walter Martens, a resident of the Klamath basin for 20 years.

Tax Figure Hits Record

PORTLAND, Aug. 12 (AP)—Oregon corporations and individuals have paid the federal government a new record total of taxes during the fiscal year ending June 30, the Portland office of the U. S. internal revenue bureau estimated today.

Portland office spokesmen set the approximate gross from income taxes on firms and individuals at \$247,000,000 compared to \$236,000,000 at the end of the previous fiscal year.

Revenues from all sources are expected to boost the grand total, including social security taxes, well above the June 30, 1946 figure of \$317,000,000, the previous record.

The Washington, D. C., office will release exact figures later, the Portland office reported.

Incinerator To Be Used

All waste from the Shasta Planting mill at 3240 So. 6th street will soon be going up in smoke in the new concrete and steel incinerator under construction. The old incinerator, moved to the location 14 years ago when the White Pine Moulding company discontinued operations, was toppled over several days ago to make room for the new larger one.

The replacement will cost approximately \$7990, is 40 feet across the base and 50 feet high. With the installation, much of the dirt and sawdust which "blew in your eye" will be eliminated. This waste until a few months ago was largely used by the city heating plant.

A new addition to the mill has been operating for some months and the plant is now surfacing from 100,000 to 120,000 feet per day. The old building, still in use, adjacent

New Highway Building Eyed

PORTLAND, Aug. 12 (AP)—Studies of plans for a new highway department office building and reorganization of the engineering, auditing and parks division were ordered as the state highway commission today took up new problems.

Discussion of the new building came after State Engineer R. H. Baldock reported yesterday that the crowded department cannot obtain additional state office building space and has been unable to rent needed quarters in Salem.

Baldock's plan calls for a \$200,000 concrete building on state highway property for a sign shop and temporary office quarters for the auditing division, which would permit

use of state office building space by other highway divisions. The proposed new office building would require two years to complete and cost about \$1,000,000.

Department reorganization was ordered studied by Baldock, Counsel J. M. Devers and H. B. Glayser, commission secretary, after Baldock asked for one or two assistant engineers. Commissioner also proposed the auditor be allowed greater independence of action and the superintendent of parks a separate budget fund.
