

Food Price Probe To Be Made

WASHINGTON, Aug. 12 (AP)—Attorney General Clark today ordered an investigation of food, clothing and housing prices.

He instructed the justice department's anti-trust division to determine whether "conspiracies" exist to maintain or to increase present prices in the food, clothing and housing fields.

All sentences, rather than merely fines, will be sought for any violators, it was announced.

A justice department statement announcing Clark's action, said: "Such conspiracies will be prosecuted criminally and in those cases the justice department will oppose acceptance by the courts of pleas of nolo contendere (no contest), and upon conviction of the defendants the department will recommend jail sentences for the individual defendants and maximum fines against the corporations."

The statement said the investigation follows a three-month study of the present price situation by Assistant Attorney General John F. Sweeney who took charge of the anti-trust division in May.

Clark feels, it was said, that "the soaring high prices now continuing in the food, clothing and housing fields, require that a new and more vigorous approach be undertaken in these fields."

Crew Saved After Crash

KODIAK, Alaska, Aug. 12 (AP)—Swept into the ice-chilled waters of the Bering sea, nine crewmen and passengers of a crashed army PHM were rescued Sunday by a lifeboat from a navy cargo vessel, the 17th naval district announced.

The plane was forced down in the bay at St. George Island, easternmost of the Pribilof, and flooded quickly when the bombardier's plexiglass nose window crumpled in the landing, the navy's announcement, made last night, said.

As the plane crashed, a lifeboat from the USS Achenar, loading seal pelts in the harbor, raced to the scene and pulled the nine men to safety just as heavy seas broke their holds on the sinking plane.

Noble suffered more than minor exposure. Names of only four of the survivors were immediately available, the navy said. They were: Lt. Lowe, pilot (first name and home town unlisted); Maj. Ralph Sims, Anchorage, and two passengers, C. L. Williams, Kodiak, and Manning Clement, Anchorage.

The PHM was attached to the 10th rescue squadron, Elmendorf field, Alaska, and was on a routine flight when forced down.

Truck Driver Jobs Open

Examinations for probational appointments to positions of Truck Driver and Mobile Crane Operator with Federal agencies in the Sacramento area and with the Bureau of Reclamation, Region 2, field areas at Redding and Fresno, California, and Klamath Falls, Oregon, have been announced by the U. S. Civil Service commission.

Salaries in this area for Mobile Crane operators will be \$225 per hour and Competitors will be graded by the Civil Service commission on the basis of the length and quality of their experience as stated in their applications. No assembled written test will be required.

Applicants must be between the ages of 18 and 62, though the maximum age limit may be waived for veterans and under certain conditions for war service, indefinite employees.
