

# Salvage Crews Prepare To Begin Operations On Sunken Alaska Line Ship

SEATTLE, Aug. 14 (AP) — Foss Tug and Tug company officials said today that divers will begin immediately to survey possibilities of salvaging portions of the \$3,000,000 cargo which was carried to the bottom of the Strait of Juan De Fuca yesterday in the sinking of the SS Diamond Knot.

The tug Mathilda Foss kept a line on the vessel during the day and overnight to mark the spot of the sinking.

The Diamond Knot, inbound from Alaska with an estimated one-ninth of the Bristol Bay salmon pack, was sheared nearly in half early yesterday when rammed by the 10,681-ton freighter Fern Victory in a dense fog.

There were no casualties.

The 38 crew members of the stricken freighter arrived here last night by bus from Port Angeles, voicing the almost unanimous feeling: "We're lucky to be alive."

Chief Electrician Harold E. Hoyt, who said he was playing cards in the messroom when the violent crash came, said:

"There was a grinding crash, like nothing you ever heard before. When we saw what hit us, we knew it was a miracle our ship wasn't cut in two and sunk like a rock."

The Diamond Knot's crew arrived here about the same time the Fern Victory made port under her own power.

No dense was the fog at the time of the collision and during the attempted salvage operations that Capt. Norman Winter, master of the Mathilda Foss, said crew members of his vessel "didn't see her sink."

Meanwhile, officials of two shipping companies on the Alaska run said passenger vessels to Alaska soon will have at least partial protection from fog-caused collisions through installation of radar.

William Semar, general manager of the Northland Transportation company, said the S. S. Alaska will be equipped for its first northward sailing Tuesday, L. W. Baker, general manager of the Alaska Steamship company, said his line's ships also would install radar as soon as equipment becomes available. It has been ordered for Alaska company and Northland ships for several months, he said.

Semar predicted the war-perfected equipment "will almost completely eliminate" the collision threat, regardless of weather.

The two officials said the firms also plan eventually to install radar on freighters that ply the frequently fog-cloaked and obstacle-marked route to Alaska.

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## Transportation News

The promotion of Herman W. Klein from assistant vice president, system freight traffic for Southern Pacific, to freight manager in charge of rates and divisions was announced by W. W. Hale, vice president of Southern Pacific.

The maximum grant of \$5 a month, dropped during the summer because the commission lacked funds, was restored on receipt of allocations from Coos and Clatsop counties.

## OVS Slates Ground School

It was announced today by officials of the Oregon Vocational school that contracts are being completed between the Oregon Vocational school, the Oregon Aircraft service, and Shasta Cascade Flying service to provide ground school instruction for flight students enrolled in those two flight schools.

At the present time tentative arrangements are that the first classes will begin at 7:30 p. m. on Monday, August 18. All flight students, whether in training for a private pilot license or a commercial rating, are required to attend the ground school. All courses will be provided at the Oregon Vocational school in accordance with existing GAA regulations and veterans administration requirements.

The chairman of the senate agriculture committee received his first formal flight instruction yesterday at the suburban Hybla Valley, Va., airport. Mrs. Pearl Thurber Robinson, chief instructor for the congressional flying club, was at the controls.
