

# FRENCH POLICE GUARD ASSEMBLY

## In The Day's News

A PARIS dispatch this morning says:

"Five thousand steel-helmeted police and mobile guards were stationed around the chamber of the national assembly today while that body continued debate on the government's five-section strike control bill, two sections of which were newly approved."

THE dispatch continues:

"The guards were placed about the assembly chamber before today's session opened. It was the first time the police had worn HELMETS during the current wave of disorders."

"Ex-GI's will remember that when you put on your helmet you expect a fight."

THE French national assembly corresponds to our congress. Its chamber of deputies corresponds to our house of representatives. If we tell that we had to put 5000 helmeted troops around the Capitol in Washington while our house of representatives debated a bill that the communists didn't like, we'd be warranted in regarding the situation as serious.

IF AS THE FRENCH HAVE DONE, we had just called up about a quarter of a million men out of the RESERVE (ex-GI's who are still subject to call for military duty) we would know the situation was serious.

WHY this tense situation in France (and the correspondingly tense situation in Italy)?

This is about it:

The communists have to beat the Marshall plan in the draw.

If the Marshall plan gets going—

If it begins to work—

If we start to make good our commitments under it—

If the 16 European nations that have accepted it and are preparing to go to work under it do their part—

If order begins to come out of chaos and a reasonable degree of comfort, well-being and hope begin to replace the despair that now grips Western Europe—

THEN—

It will be forever too late for the Moscow communists to try to rule Europe and after Europe the world.

The ways of free enterprise, of freedom of the individual, will then have proved themselves superior to the way of communism.

So the communists are ACTING NOW, while there is still time.

ALL this, of course, is guesswork on the part of this writer, who has no sources of information inside the Kremlin. But it seems a reasonable guess.

IN Washington this morning, the house foreign affairs committee, urging prompt action on the \$390 million "stop-gap" aid bill that is the first step of the Marshall plan, makes public a report in which it says that Soviet Russia now has four million men under arms.

The chairman of the committee was asked from the floor:

"What could stop Russia from taking over all of Europe in 24 hours?"

He answered:

"Not a thing."

HE went on:

"Russia proposes to conquer the world either by internal infiltration, by revolution or by force of arms."

I believe Russia desires to delay an actual conquest by arms as long as possible. (The Soviets meanwhile) have a clear and definite policy of attempting to prevent American aid to Europe or Asia and a further policy of making such aid as ineffective as possible."

THESE are indeed serious times. Important decisions must be made. The result of these decisions will be far-reaching.

In making these decisions, we must be PATRIOTIC rather than POLITICAL.

## NAM Head Asks Production Up

NEW YORK, Dec. 3 (AP)—Earl Bunting, president of the National Association of Manufacturers, today called for increased productivity, emergency foreign relief in goods not dollars, and reductions in government spending and income taxes.

His program, he said, would "nullify the administration's proposal to establish a 'police state' in America."

He also asked labor leaders to forego demands for general wage increases without increases in productivity, except in cases of gross inequities.

"All feather-bedding rules should be set aside," he said, as well as "all restrictions on individual productivity not essential to employee safety and health."

His speech was the highlight of the opening of the National Association of Manufacturers' 52nd annual congress of American industry, which brought more than 300 industrialists from all over the country to the Waldorf-Astoria for a three day session.

He answered:

"Not a thing."

## Vet Admits Putting Out Eyes Of Dog

Shade Auburn Nelson, 21-year-old ex-marine, admitted under questioning this morning by state police that he deliberately poured poison crystals, permanent of polach, in the eyes of a small dog at Henley last Tuesday with the result that the dog's eyes were literally burned out.

Nelson said he was trying to doctor the animal's eyes, believing them to be sore, and insisted that he did not realize what the effect of the potent poison would be.

The dog, a Springer spaniel, owned by Art Quigley, was found Wednesday of last week, blind and in intense pain. He was destroyed by a veterinarian.

When arrested Monday, the Arkansas-born youth, told officers a solution of the poison had splashed on the dog accidentally, but since that time he had admitted he was not telling the truth about that and about several other details he had related before.

But he has steadily denied maliciously trying to blind the dog. He said that a few hours after he put the crystals in the animal's eyes he noticed the pup was in pain and tried to wash his eyes with water. The next day, Wednesday, Nelson said he attempted to wash the eyes with a solution of water and vinegar, antidote for the poison. But the eyes were gone then.

Nelson said that he had been "too scared" of a prison sentence to admit having blinded the dog before. He said he expects at least two years in prison.

Nelson is to be taken into justice court this afternoon on a charge of cruelty to animals. At present he is under a 10-day holding sentence for hunting without a license.

Authoritative informants described Dulles' trip as a "personal" fact-finding mission which has the approval of Marshall.

## Supplemental Freight Rate Boost Asked

WASHINGTON, Dec. 3 (AP)—The Association of American Railroads today asked a supplemental freight rate increase of approximately three per cent to offset rising costs.

In a petition filed with the interstate commerce commission, the association said the increase would be in addition to requests now pending and would yield \$164,700,000 annually.

This figure was the association's estimate of the increased operating costs resulting from the raise of 15 cents hourly granted members of the conductors and trainmen's brotherhood, plus the costs of similar increases given three other brotherhoods.

The railroads are currently pressing an action before the ICC for a general 27 per cent permanent rate increase. Ten per cent of this was temporarily granted by the commission in early October in response to the carriers' plea for quick "emergency relief" to counter some of the wage adjustments which became effective on September 1.

At hearings on the emergency grant, railroad officials clearly indicated that if further wage revisions were made, or there were other increases in operating costs, the companies would have to come back to the commission with a request for a further rate boost.

## 35 Killed During Two Day Fighting

Arabs and Jews fought bloody street battles with machine guns, knives, grenades and fire in the no-man's land between Jaffa and Tel Aviv today in a resumption of Holy Land rioting over the decision to partition Palestine.

About 35 were counted dead on both sides, by unofficial estimates, in two days of communal warfare, throughout the country.

Scores Wounded

The Jews, unofficial reports said, lost about 12 dead and scores wounded since the Arabs called their three-day protest strike yesterday.

Hebrew newspapers said 15 Arabs were slain today in three battles along the border between all-Jewish Tel Aviv and all-Jewish Jaffa.

Among the Jewish dead today was Moshe Newman, a commander of Hagana, the underground Jewish militia.

Another Jewish underground group, Irgun Zvai Leumi, warned Arabs in a radio broadcast "we shall take action against you" if the attacks continue.
