

# Arab Riots Fail To Halt US Oil Wells

RAB TANURA, Saudi Arabia (via cable) (AP)—Vital U. S. oil operations in Saudi Arabia are proceeding on schedule, despite mounting Arab-Jewish riots throughout the Middle East.

The iron rule of Saudi Arabia's King Saud is preventing disruption of the American oil field concessions.

Some hot-headed Arabs here, however, caught the fever of violence that is spreading throughout the Holy Land, in Cairo and other Middle East sections in the wake of the United Nations Palestine partition ruling.

"They tried to stage a protest strike over the Palestine issue," the move was immediately crushed by Amir Turki Bin Atallah, King Bin Saud's personal agent here.

"The strike would have hit operations at Arabian American Oil company's principal refinery at Ras Tanura, on the Persian gulf."

I talked with Amir Turki after he conferred with Arab chiefs who came to find out about Saudi Arabian policy on the Palestine partition issue.

"We want no trouble with the Americans here in Saudi Arabia," Amir Turki said.

"They are our friends. I treat them as my own subjects."

## School Blasts Red Branding

**SEATTLE, Dec. 5 (AP)—**Attorney General Tom Clark's description of the Seattle labor school as "an apparent adjunct of the communist party" was denounced today by the school's educational director as "an example of the alarming and increasing trend towards thought control by the use of fear and smear tactics."

"The position of the school has been clear from the outset," said Director Bert MacLeck. "It was organized by and for unions interested in the democratic, co-operative and scientific approach to the problems of labor and the community."

Approval of the attorney general's action was expressed by various other labor leaders. Regional CIO Director Roy W. Atkinson said the "school has needed to be called for its radical activities for a long time."

Joe Curran, international president of the National Maritime Union, last week ordered the Seattle local to "immediately cease" contributions to the school.

Former democratic Rep. Hugh DeLoach, who has taught classes at the school, said the move "certainly surprised" him.

"It is a most un-American action," he said.

## Jaywalking Charge Leads To Prison

**LOS ANGELES, Dec. 5 (AP)—**Morris Plaskoff spent 18 days in the city jail on a jaywalking citation and then the charge was dismissed. The usual penalty for jaywalking is a \$2 fine.

Plaskoff, a 59-year-old laborer, demanded a jury trial when he was arraigned before Municipal Judge Walter Odeman. The judge fixed bail at \$50 but Plaskoff failed to post it and went to jail. Yesterday, 18 days later, the defendant appeared for trial—the arresting

officer, who had issued the citation in August, 1946, failed to show up in court. With this the case was dismissed. Plaskoff was arrested last November 17 on a warrant.
