## First Christian Revival Sessions To End Sunday

The closing sessions of the revival will be held at the First Christian church this Sunday. Evangelist Ross will speak both morning and evening, sermons on "Love Glorifying the Gift" and "What Think Ye of Christ?" The crayon picture, "In the Harbor Land," will be drawn by Evangelist Ross and given to the Mt. Laki Christian Endeavorers, who will be special guests. ## Church Fund Goal Reached

TULELAKE, Dec. 5 (P)—The \$30,000 goal set for this year for the building fund of the proposed new Tulelake Community Presbyterian church has been reached and plans for the building will proceed as rapidly as possible. Actual construction should get under way by March 1, weather permitting.

The plans for the new structure have been considered since before the war and the project is definitely a community effort. Sixty persons assisted with the campaign to raise funds and this campaign will be renewed next year to bring the overall total to near \$50,000.

Present plans call for a brick structure to house the sanctuary, church offices, Sunday school class rooms, large foyer, altar, and room for future installation of a pipe organ. Seating capacity of the sanctuary will be 240. A new heating plant will be installed to take care of the needs of the new building and the present structure.

Architect Frederick Eley, Salem, Ore., has asked two months to complete blueprints for the building.


