Thimble Club

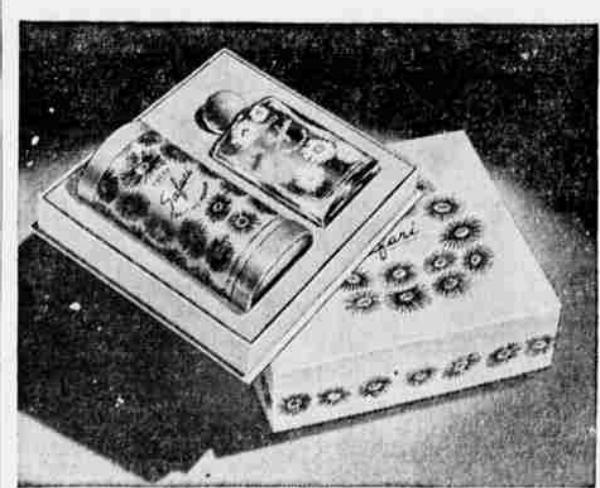
