

Hornets Lose Class B Grid Title To Warriors

Speedy Amity Eleven, Tied a 12-12 Score, Captures 1947 Small School Crown on Total First Downs, 14-9

Twice this now dead-and-buried football season a Klamath team picked the hard way to lose a critical game—leaving the decision to statistics—and the Saturday incident cost the Henley Hornets their state class B gridiron title. The diadem went to a classy band of Warriors from Amity of total first downs after the score was a flip-flop at 12-12.

It was just a couple of weeks ago that the Klamath Pelicans tied The Dalles Indians 13-13 for the score, 8-8 in first downs and lost out on yardage. The Dalles Saturday afternoon clubbed Hillsboro 47-7 to win the state A crown.

But Amity won Saturday's Modoc field scrimmage with plenty to spare and all of some 3000 spectators knew it. By the time five minutes of the first quarter were used up it was apparent that Ray Stephens' big boys from Yamhill county had what it takes—speed, power through the line, a driving defense and brains.

Amity scored in the first and third periods, Henley in the third and fourth, and all conversion tries were good. But the Warriors were never in arrears as far as first downs and yardage are concerned.

And first downs and yardage are vitally concerned in the Oregon prep system of deciding ties on the gridiron. The Warriors finished with 14 first downs and 212 yards gained, to 9 and 147 for the Hornets.

Early in the first chapter Amity controlled the ball on their 38 and went to the Henley 10 in seven ground plays. Johnny Nauman, left half, passed to End Bob Burns in the pay zone for six points. Burns' kick was no good, and the 6-0 score stood through the half.

Amity was pushing toward the Hornet goal as the result of a blocked kick as the second period opened, when Dale Webber intercepted a Nauman pass. A punt and an Amity fumble on the Henley 46 set up the best Hornet ground drive of the afternoon, but the Warriors held for downs on the 3.

The third period saw a couple of punts for each side before Amity's 190-pound Burns pulled a cutie.

Dale Newham had gone back to punt on the Henley 3 and Burns crashed on through like a wild freight. He took to the ball and Newham's foot right in his midriff, shook the foot loose and stepped over the double stripe for Amity's second touchdown.

In all probability, Burns was the best lineman of any class to set a cleat on Modoc field this season. He was never stopped.

Burns tried a pass for conversion, but Nauman couldn't field it. The Warriors, playing without substitution, were obviously tiring when they kicked off, while the Henley boys suddenly got hot.

Clarence Adams returned the kick 15 yards to the 38. Cal Noble picked up nine in two tries and a rushing penalty put the ball on the Amity 38. A pass and lateral. Noble to Webber to Clessan Mecham gained 10 yards and then Archie Rutter drilled a perfect aerial to Adams in the end zone.

Adams had caught the Amity defense flat-footed and was all alone when he pulled in the aerial. Rutter's buck was no good and Henley trailed, 12-6.

The final tally came in the fourth period, started by Rutter's pass interception and 34-yard run-back to the Amity 38. Noble flipped a shortie to Adams who beat his way to the 20. Noble hit right tackle for four, then lobbed another pass to Adams out to the left.

Adams took the ball on the 10, was hit hard once and dived over. Little Delbert Arant came in to try for the point which might have been the winner. His kick had the range but was off to the left.

In the waning minutes of the game the play was mostly in mid-field, with Amity trying to hold the ball and the Hornets trying to break away. On their last series of plays the Hornets probably made a tactical error in trying to run the ball instead of pass, but on the final play Rutter did try a long one which Arvey Nelson intercepted to end the game.

After the game OSHAA trophies were presented to both teams and 27 Amity Warriors received small grid footballs, emblematic of the fact they played on the 1947 Oregon class B championship team.

Andy Lazor Best On Cougar Squad

At this point, Catterall, OSC's slim forward, banged in five straight points and then together with Crandall, the Beavers' all-coast forward, sliced away at the Canastota lead until it was 39-57 with nine minutes remaining in the game.

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BROOKLYN MAY TRADE FAMOUS DIXIE WALKER

NEW YORK, Dec. 8 (AP)—The annual major league conference does not officially begin until tomorrow, but the baseball David Harms may beat the gun with announcement of the all-but-closed three-way deal involving Dixie Walker of the Brooklyn Dodgers, Billy Cox of the Pittsburgh Pirates and Eddie Waitkus of the Chicago Cubs.

That is only one of at least a half dozen transactions of major importance that may be completed at the three-day sessions here.

Sparks are expected to fly when the magnates take up clarification of the rule restricting tampering with high school players.

The Pacific coast again will present its plea for big league recognition at Thursday's joint meeting. Should the majors refuse, as is likely, Coast President Clarence Rowland will seek a compromise, requesting a major-minor classification which would place the PCL just under the big leagues and over the two other triple A's.

The 10-team idea in the National and American leagues, which came to light at the Miami minor league convention, is due to be brought out in the open at the joint meeting.

The idea was first suggested by Commissioner Chandler after the executive council had voted against the coast's plan for major league status.

With the exception of Leo Durocher, the "forgotten" manager of the Dodgers, all 16 big league pilots will be on hand. Durocher, rehired only Saturday by the Brooks, has flown back to Los Angeles.

Sportsmen Urge Trout Protection
BEND, Dec. 8 (AP)—Adequate irrigation canal screening to protect Central Oregon's trout was urged by Deschutes county sportsmen at a week-end meeting here which resulted in appointment of a committee to study game conditions throughout the state.

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Pro Football Speeds Toward Season's End

NEW YORK, Dec. 8 (AP)—While the All-America football conference is settling its championship next Sunday, the rival National league will be attempting to decide its division titlists.

The Cleveland Browns clash with the Yankees in New York for the All-America title. At the same time the Chicago Cardinals and the Chicago Bears will meet in the windy city for the National's western half crown while the Philadelphia Eagles entertain the Green Bay Packers with the eastern half flag at stake.

A crushing 45-21 Cardinal triumph over the Eagles and Los Angeles' 17-14 surprise victory over the Bears yesterday set the stage for next Sunday's important conflicts in the National loop.

Trailing 7-3 at the end of the half, the visiting Cards exploded for six touchdowns in the second half to rout the Eagles and tie the Bears for the western lead. Both Chicago eleven's sport 8-3 win and lost records.

The defeat dropped the Eagles into second place, a half game behind the Pittsburgh Steelers, who vaulted to the top after their 17-7 win over the Boston Yanks. The Steelers have completed their schedule and the Eagles must whip the Packers to stay in the picture. An Eagle triumph over the Packers will deadlock the eastern half race and necessitate a playoff for the title.

At Pittsburgh, the Steelers hoped off to a 10-0 lead over the Yanks and clung to it to the delight of 31,398 fans.

In remaining National league encounters, the New York Giants trounced the Washington Redskins, 35-10, and the Packers toppled the Detroit Lions, 35-14.

Meanwhile, the Yanks and Browns tuned up for their All-America title battle. The Yanks beat the Brooklyn Dodgers, 20-17, and Browns topped the Baltimore Colts, 42-0.

On the Pacific coast, the Los Angeles Dons ramblod to a 34-14 decision over the Chicago Rockets and the San Francisco 49ers battled the Buffalo Bills to a 21-21 stalemate in the conference's other games.

The Indians pulled another touchdown in the first quarter, a pair in the second, a single in the third and two more in the fourth to humble their opponents.

After the initial Hillsboro drive to 'The Dalles' six, which set the stage for Hughes' sensational open field run, the Spartans never seriously threatened the fast, heavier and smooth working Tribesmen until the lone touchdown and conversion in the final period.

The Dalles scored 16 first downs to 11 for Hillsboro and collected 346 net yards to 220 for the Spartans.

Pelicans Drop To Shasta High
REDDING, Dec. 8 (AP)—Shasta high school's basketball team turned the tables on the Klamath Falls Pelicans here Saturday night, winning two games after having lost two Friday.

The Pelicans fell to a last quarter Shasta rush by 38-34, and the junior varsity lost to the Redding reserves, 40 to 23.

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
