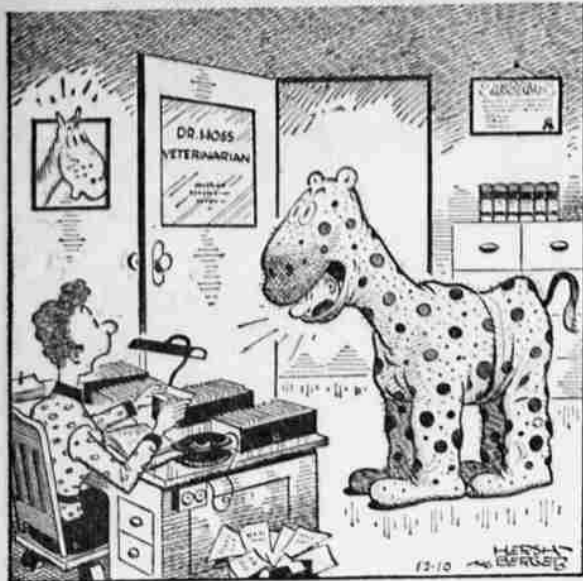

an epidemic of mumps in the community. The Malin Senior prom was held Friday night, December 5, at the high school gym. Baldy Evans furnished the music.

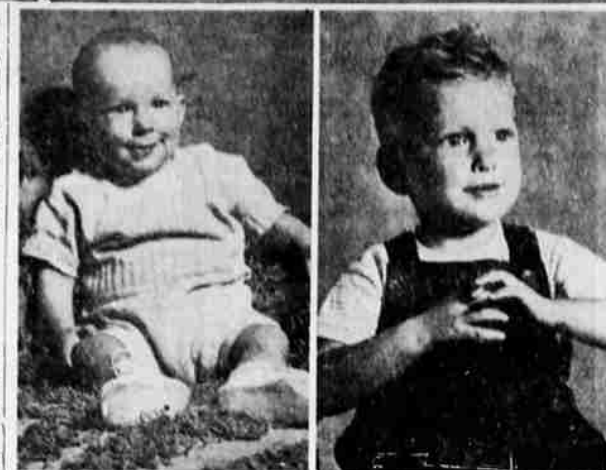

Port Okays Ramp Extension

PORTLAND, Dec. 10 (AP)—The Port of Portland commission Tuesday approved a \$131,183 bid from the K. F. Jacobson company for extension of concrete ramps at the Portland-Columbia airport.

The extension will be on the air-traffic loading area. The bid will go to the civil aeronautics administration in Washington for final approval. The CAA would furnish 38 per cent of the funds.

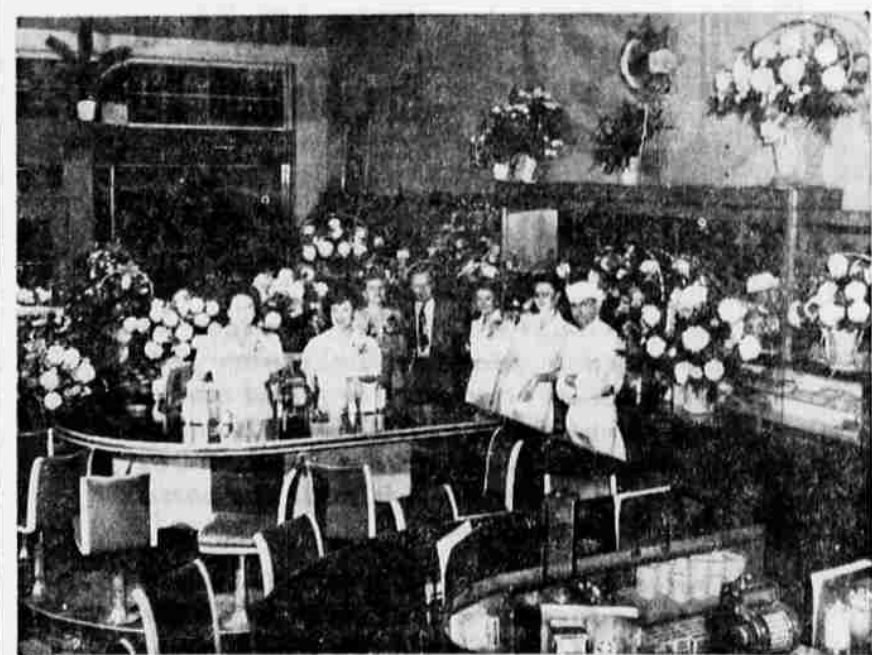
