

Hoof-Mouth Threat To Oregon Cows

Faced with the threat of invasion of hoof-and-mouth disease from Mexico, the Oregon livestock industry is rallying its defense forces against the dread scourge.

P. M. Brandt, head of the division of animal industries at Oregon State college, states that the possibility of eradicating foot-and-mouth disease from Mexico is remote under existing conditions. Effective control in this country might even be doubtful, he said, if widespread infection occurred.

A program of slaughter is the only means of control, Brandt said, and the present situation is created by the abandonment by Mexico of the program which was under way there in the past year in cooperation with United States department of agriculture veterinarians in attempting to suppress the outbreak.

An outbreak in California some years ago was eradicated by wholesale slaughter of infected herds, and it looks as though cattlemen may again be faced with such a drastic cure, Brandt said, advising Northwest dairymen and stockmen that they might well be considering measures and practices which will best protect this section of the country.

Efforts will be made, the animal industries man said, to hold a defense line several hundred miles south of the international border, but occasional breaks in the defense line can be expected.

ACP Limit Set At \$500

Farmers who are planning now to carry out soil and water conservation practices under the 1948 agricultural conservation program should not overlook the \$500 limitation on payments, advises Burrell Short, chairman of the Klamath county ACP committee. He said that although less than 2 per cent of the farmers who participated in the

1946 program earned more than \$500, all farmers should be aware that under the 1948 program no payment to any one person is to exceed \$500.

Mr. Short explained that payments made to farmers under the agricultural conservation program are to help defray the cost of approved conservation practices which are needed to protect the nation's soil and water resources. Instead of hiring the work done, the U. S. department of agriculture through the ACP assists farmers in carrying out the needed conservation practices. Assistance is given both in pay-

ments and in materials and services. This assistance averages about 50 per cent of the cost with, in many instances, the farmer doing the work. Again in 1948, as in past years, every dollar of federal funds will be made to go as far as possible in buying conservation. County and state farmer committees have been working out the details of the 1948 agricultural conservation program so that a conservation program can be carried on within the limits of available funds.

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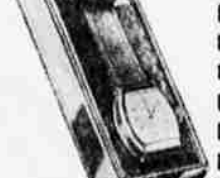

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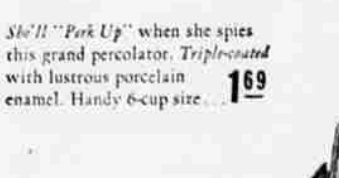

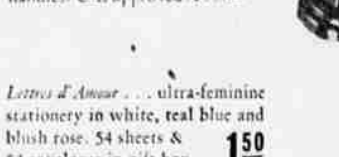
