

# Tax Hearing Set Wednesday

SALEM, Dec. 11 (AP)—The state supreme court said today it would hear arguments next Wednesday on whether the new state income tax increases and the 1 per cent withholding tax are constitutional.

The case is an appeal from the decision of Marion County Circuit Judge George R. Duncan, who ruled the taxes are valid.

The taxes were contested by the state Federation of Labor, which contended it is illegal for the legislature to make them dependent upon the defeat of the sales tax.

The high court probably will have a decision before January 1, the date on which the withholding tax is to take effect.

# New Engine To Go Into Service

SEATTLE, Dec. 11 (AP)—Great Northern railroad officials said today nine new diesel-electric locomotives would be in operation over its lines between Wenatchee and St. Paul by the end of this week.

The 4500-horsepower locomotives will operate the line's Original Limited and fast mail over the 1628-mile route. On the remaining 156 miles between Wenatchee and Seattle, these trains will continue to use electric locomotives through the Cascade mountains and steam power the remainder of the way.

# Russian Visitor Limitation Asked

WASHINGTON, Dec. 11 (AP)—Senator Bridges (R-N.H.) proposed Wednesday that the United States limit visits by Russians to the number of Americans the Soviets are willing to receive.

Introducing legislation to that end, Bridges said this country should give Russian citizens "the same treatment x x x as Soviet Russia permits us behind the iron curtain."

His resolution would require action by the secretary of state, within 31 days, after its approval by both houses of congress, to cancel visas now outstanding to the extent that they exceed the number issued to Americans by Moscow.

It would extend the same treatment to any other country which the president determined is controlled or dominated by Russia.

# Weed Control Interest Grows

Farmers really are interested in weeds and in equipment for controlling them.

This is shown by the attendance at the series of 25 weed control meetings held in Western Oregon counties during the last few weeks. These meetings drew an attendance of 329 farmers. That's an average attendance of 133 at each meeting.

Here's a few general words of advice, given by Virgil Freed, weed-control authority at the state agricultural experiment station:

In spraying weeds, you should use at least 10 gallons of water and 2-4-D mixture per acre. This appears to give most economical results without apparent crop injury.

For weeds that are comparatively easy to kill, dissolve one-half to three-quarters pounds of 2-4-D per acre in the 10 gallons of water.

This should be sufficient to take care of such weeds as mustard, the vetches, sweet clover, fan weed, peppercorn and so on.

Weeds such as Canada thistle, white top, and morning glory are harder to kill, but they can be controlled by 2-4-D. However, heavier applications are needed. As a word of caution, do not use more than 1 1/2 pounds of the parent 2-4-D per acre for weeds in grain fields. In any case, farmers should consult with their local county agents or other agricultural advisers on the right amount to use.

To get best results, apply the spray when the weeds are making the most rapid growth.
