African Missionary To Speak

Dr. E. R. Moon, for 15 years missionary to the African Congo, will speak Sunday at the First Christian church at 11 o'clock and again in the evening.

Dr. Moon was one of the last of the pioneer missionaries in the Congo, having chartered more than 500 miles of the Juappa river, and grateful pilots still use his charts. He assembled the steamer "Ore-ko," the "good news" ship as the natives termed it, and for many years was its captain on the Congo river and its tributaries. He taught the Africans how to make boards and bricks with which he built churches, schools and hospitals on the equator. He translated parts of the Bible into two Congo dialects. For exploration and map-making in the Ubangi district he was made a

Fellow of the Royal Geographic Society of London.

In later years, Dr. Moon served as missionary to Jamaica and taught in the College of Missions, Butler University, and Northwest Christian college. A resident of Eugene, he is one of the most popular lecturers and evangelists in the Northwest.

Dr. Moon is coming at the invitation of the Women's council for the express purpose of commemorating the annual observance of Woman's Day, a special missionary day held the first part of December in many Christian churches throughout the land.

A most cordial invitation is extended to anyone wishing to hear this interesting speaker.
