

## TRANSPORTATION NEWS U.S. Leases Panama Base

General Motors' Train of Tomorrow is due back in Klamath Falls on its southbound run to San Francisco at 3 o'clock Saturday afternoon tomorrow, on the Southern Pacific rails. It will stop over in Klamath Falls for approximately 30 minutes and anyone interested may look over the exterior of the train during its stay here.

Robert Houck, SP district freight and passenger agent, said today that efforts to make it possible for Klamath folks to go through the train were unavailing and the best local train fans can expect is a good exterior look at the Train of Tomorrow, astra dome and all.

Although heavy snow was reported in the northern section of the county, the SP's big rotary snow plow has not been called out on snow removal duty. Steam is up in the big plow and ready to go at the drop of the hat, but there has been no necessity thus far, Houck said.

Increasing daily are movements of mail out of Klamath Falls, both north and southbound loads reported heavier than each day previous. Some 10 to 12 baggage trucks were meeting trains this week, and by the first of next week the outgoing peak will probably be chalked up.

Also noticeably on the increase are shipments of brewing barley from the Tulelake area. The consignments are to Anheuser-Busch in St. Louis, Mo., and Schlitz Breweries in Milwaukee, Wis. Staley, Malone and Tulelake are top shipping points. Staley (the old Jap camp), shipping out some six cars daily, five daily out of Malone and some two out of Tulelake. The barley has been in storage and just now being loaded for Midwest destinations.

Henzel Brothers elevator at Worden is still filled with more than 350 carloads of brewing barley. Shipment of this pile is expected shortly after the first of the year.

Well drilling near the Great Northern roundhouse was rudely interrupted a couple of weeks ago when the driller, C. M. Wick of St. Paul, Minn., broke his leg. Wick was pulling on a piece of casing when the brake on the cable drum slipped and the casing dropped, breaking Wick's right leg. He is remaining here through his convalescence and will go back on the job when the leg permits. Mrs. Wick is here with her husband.

In the meantime, Wick's helper is also staying on, working around the shops. The well is being drilled for cold water to be used for GN equipment.

## U.S. Leases Panama Base

WASHINGTON, Dec. 12 (AP)—The state department announced Wednesday that the United States and Panama have signed an agreement for leasing an air base and 13 defense sites to the U. S. to be used for defense of the Panama canal.

The joint announcement with Panama said the agreement calls for five-year leases on 13 different sites in Panama and a 10-year lease with an option for ten more on the huge B-29 air base at Rio Hato, about 70 miles west of Panama City.

The agreement, under negotiation for 16 months, is subject to approval by the Panama national assembly, which is scheduled to meet Friday.
