

Methodists Launch Drive

BUCK HILL FALLS, Pa., Dec. 12 (AP)—A vigorous program by Methodists and other Protestant churches to counteract communism, fascism and atheism in Latin America was recommended to the board of missions and church extension of the Methodist church.

The church for Latin America is part of a four-year program to double the foreign missionary staff of the Methodist church as well as the present financial aid of the church for missionary purposes in all five continents.

They were made yesterday to the board at its annual session by Dr. Ralph E. Diffendorfer of New York, executive secretary of the board's division on foreign missions and for 24 years head of the denominational overseas service.

Dr. Diffendorfer asked for 500 new missionaries and a total budget of \$10,747,685 for the next four years of the grand total he recommended \$5,120,000 be allocated for Latin American projects.

Real Estate Finding Pends

SPOKANE, Dec. 12 (AP)—Sentences were deferred today on a 59-year-old woman who pleaded guilty to a charge of grand larceny in which she was accused of having pyramided real estate holdings in her name to more than \$200,000 in five months.

Prosecuting Attorney Leslie M. Carroll said the woman, Gertrude Warren, had admitted orally making down payments on houses, renting them to persons willing to pay a year's rent in advance, and using the rentals for down payments on other houses.

"When she was arrested, she had about \$3 in her purse, and that seems to be all the money she has," Carroll said.

After her plea of guilty to the grand larceny charge, Superior Judge Louis Bunge deferred sentence pending further study of her financial dealings.

Jap Scandal Probe Slated

TOKYO, Dec. 12 (AP)—Japan was on the verge of her first intensive "teapot dome" investigation today. A new diet committee armed with unprecedented powers will be appointed to push an investigation of a gigantic scandal involving the illegal sale of billions of yen worth of military supplies in the immediate post-surrender confusion.

Fresh authority to expedite the probe, which already has hit several key cities and threatens top-ranking politicians, was voted by what authorities sources described as a "frightened" house of representatives last night.

The house approved a surprise resolution calling for a new 30-man committee with emphatic authority, including the first right of administering an oath ever held by a Japanese parliamentary investigative body. The resolution was the last item of business before the diet adjourned until January 20.

School Enrollment Shows Big Gain

SPOKANE, Dec. 12 (AP)—High school enrollment in Washington state increased a total of 1424 students last year, the largest increase registered by any of the six western states, Alaska or Hawaii.

The record growth was disclosed yesterday in a report submitted to the Northwest association of secondary and higher schools by Dr. Walter R. Ames of the University of Montana.

Oregon high schools listed an increase of 876 students to rank second.

Farm Prices To Remain High

CORVALLIS, Dec. 12 (AP)—A farm cost and crop price survey by Oregon State college indicated today that farm commodities will continue to command high prices through next year.

The report said the general level of prices received by farmers increased 6 per cent in the year from October 1946 to October 1947, while at the same time prices paid by farmers for goods increased 14 per cent and farm wages increased 7 per cent.
