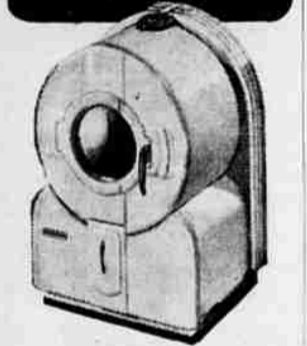
Lodge Party

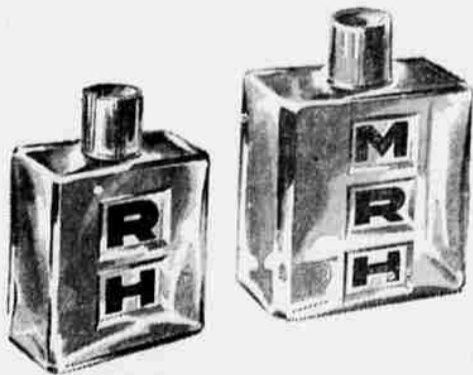
