

### Distillers Face Ration

WASHINGTON, Dec. 15 (AP)—The cabinet food committee Saturday recommended that the whiskey distilling industry ration itself to 2,500,000 bushels of grain a month and forego the use of wheat when the distillery holiday ends December 24.

In a letter to distillers, Secretary of Agriculture Anderson, chairman of the cabinet body, proposed that the new plan be carried out "during the next six months and so long thereafter as the need for grain conservation continues."

The proposed grain consumption compares with a usage of 8,000,000 bushels in October, immediately prior to the nationwide shutdown and an average of 5,000,000 bushels monthly in the 12 months which ended last June 30.

The whiskey making holiday is a 60-day period agreed to in connection with the campaign to conserve grain to make more available for food abroad.

Anderson proposed a grain allocation for each plant, which he said was based on the capacity and past consumption record of every distiller.

### School Cost Meet Postponed

A discussion of tuition fees between the county school board and a committee of Indians from the Klamath reservation, scheduled for today, has been postponed until Wednesday morning at 10 a. m.

The conference will be held in the county courthouse. The meeting was called in an effort to work out a better tuition system for Indian students attending Klamath county schools, by action of both the school board and Indian general council.

### Highway Department Calls For Bids

The state highway commission called for bids Saturday on 12 projects over the state, to cost an estimated \$2,000,000.

Only one of the projects in this vicinity is one to provide 10,000 cubic yards of crushed gravel on the Silver Creek - Harvey Creek rock production project of the Fremont highway in Lake county.

Bids will be opened in Portland December 29 and 30.

### Hop Growers To Hold Meeting

SALEM, Dec. 15 (AP)—A decision to hold hearings and conduct further investigations regarding the proposed new hop marketing agreement was reached by over 100 hop growers at a meeting in Salem Friday.

Findings will be worked into a final marketing act and presented to the growers from whom it will need a two-thirds favorable vote to become effective.
