Wissenbach Week's Artist

The Rev. F. C. Wissenbach of St. Paul's Episcopal church is current "Artist of the Week" for the Klamath Art association exhibit in the Jewel and Gift shop. He is showing some of his later oil paintings, including Lake McDonald with Stantion mountain in Glacier national park, a scene at the headwaters of Wood river, a fishing hole on the Deschutes river, and the cook shack at Shippington.

Many are familiar with Rev. Wissenbach's striking studies of the American Indian, as well as his landscapes and interpretations of religious subjects. He works with both pen and ink and oils, being mostly concerned with drawing. He took extra duties for two years during the war as special art instructor at KUHS, in addition to his church work. Receiving his art education in Europe at art schools in Paris, Munich and the Polytechnic school in connection with the University of Frankfurt. Rev. Wissenbach received his M.A. from the University of Sorbonne, Paris. He states his ideal is still the old masters, especially Holbein and Durer.

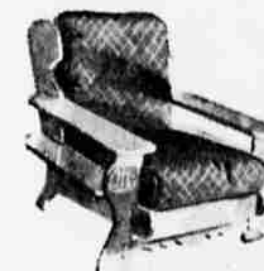
