Community Cooperation Brings Wiard Park To Reality As Work Progresses

Through community cooperation and a year of effort on the part of Harry L. Wiard, the south suburb's new playground, the Wiard Memorial park is a reality. The five-acre recreation area between Hope and Wiard streets, just off S. 6th, was purchased last fall from the Klamath county court with court stipulation that the ground be used for park purposes.

The project was the brain child of the Shasta View grange but it fell to Mr. Wiard to get the ball rolling. He is a member of both the grange and the Suburban league and since 1925 has been actively associated with the progress of Klamath county.

The purchase price of \$3500 was raised by contributions of cash and a money-raising project for which Mr. Wiard was immediately responsible. Plans for the grounds which will include a swimming pool, tennis courts, ball ground, picnic area, children's playground, and later a community hall, were drawn by Andrew Bergloff, Klamath Union high school graduate. Assisting with the

arrangement of planting has been Clifford Jay of the office of Sheldon Brumbaugh. Soon after it became known in the suburban area and in Klamath Falls that the park program was actually under way offers of assistance in addition to cash began pouring in. These include the donation of trees, shrubbery, playground equipment, grass seed, rock for the proposed monuments, operation of equipment for preparation of the ground, pipe for the water system, picnic benches and tables and just common "hard work."

It is proposed to build large native rock markers at entrances on both streets, these to bear bronzed plaques inscribed with the names of Klamath county pioneers and others actively associated with the original park development.

To date some 450 shade trees, flowering trees and shrubs have been planted, a bank between Wiard street and the park has been removed and the land is ready for seeding to lawn next spring. Improvements will be added as rapidly as possible and the accumulation of funds allows. Work is already under

way on picnic equipment, benches and tables and on playground equipment, some of which is being built by interested persons.

Parking space will be available for 450 cars.

Members of the present park board appointed by the Shasta View grange and the Suburban league are Frank Steele, 3704 Cannon street, railway employee; Elton Fishback, principal of the Shasta View school; Harry L. Wiard, owner of the Wiard Chicken center; and Ruth E. King of the Merrill road. The fifth member of the board, Howard Burkhard, building contractor, was appointed by the original board. Acting officers who will serve until January 1 are Frank Steele, chairman, and Mrs. King, secretary-treasurer.

It is probable that organization of a park district will be necessary at some future time to insure perpetual maintenance of the park. Details will be worked out as the plans expand.

Just now residents of the community adjacent to the park are appreciating the big lighted Christmas tree that was placed by Mr. Wiard.

The park board acknowledges the following unpublished contributions made since a list was published several months ago, at which time more than \$1200 had been received.

Trees and shrubs, Lakeshore gardens, Green gardens, Klamath Flower shop, Hal Ogle and C. A. Dunn; 25 benches, Howard Burkhard; 25 tables, Mettler Bros.; merry-go-round, Vern Pugh; slide, Eagle's lodge; swings, Homedale Potluck club; concrete pipe, Somers Pipe company; \$100, W. D. Miller, Louis Soukup, Chris Blanas; \$50, Fred Russ, Brown and Thompson; \$25, Mrs. W. E. Lamm, Gladys Hogue, Eagles lodge; \$10, Bertram Jewell.

Anyone caring to help swell the fund which will bring to this rapidly expanding district its first park may contact any one of the board members.

NUERNBERG, Germany, Dec. 18 (AP)—Gustav Streb, a guard at the Schuco toy factory, gently laid a tiny red roadster on the table.

It dashed to the edge, hung dizzily over the void, then did a neat about face and repeated the wild acrobatic on the other side.

A whirling little wheel under the chassis, gripping the table as the front wheels dropped off the edge, explained the "magic."

"None of these for German children this Christmas," Streb said, winding up another intricate little model featuring gear shifts and horn.

What's left of Nuernberg's 300-

year-old toy industry produces only for export—to get food, raw materials, machinery. German kids will have wooden or cardboard toys. "We're not making toy soldiers any more," said Hammerschmidt. "There's an order against it. But I think it may be revised."

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
