Treatment.—Mrs. B. A. Hardin, route 3 box 166, was admitted late last night by ambulance to Hillside hospital for treatment of pneumonia.

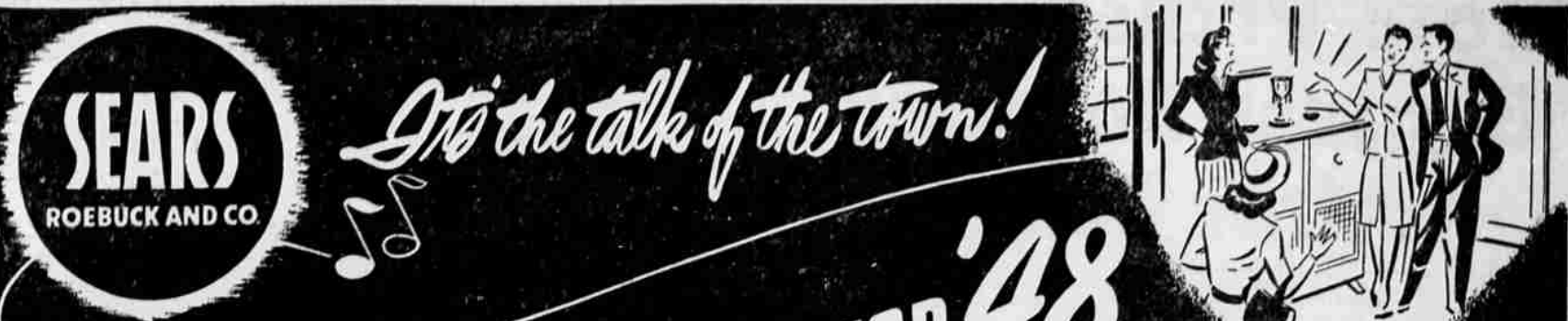
In Hospital.—Mrs. Ray Rieger, office nurse for Dr. Marvin Nerseith, is receiving medical care at Hillside hospital.

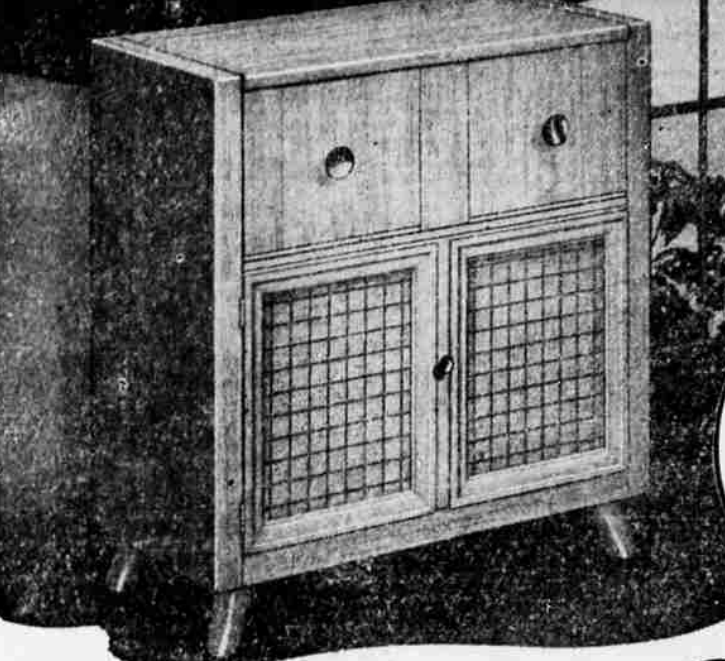

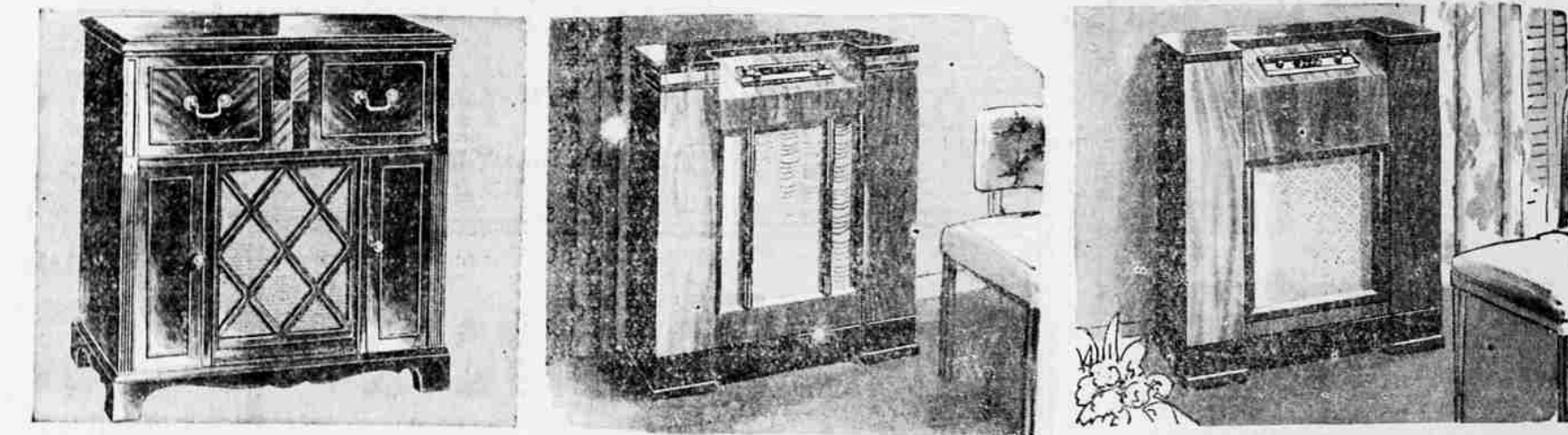

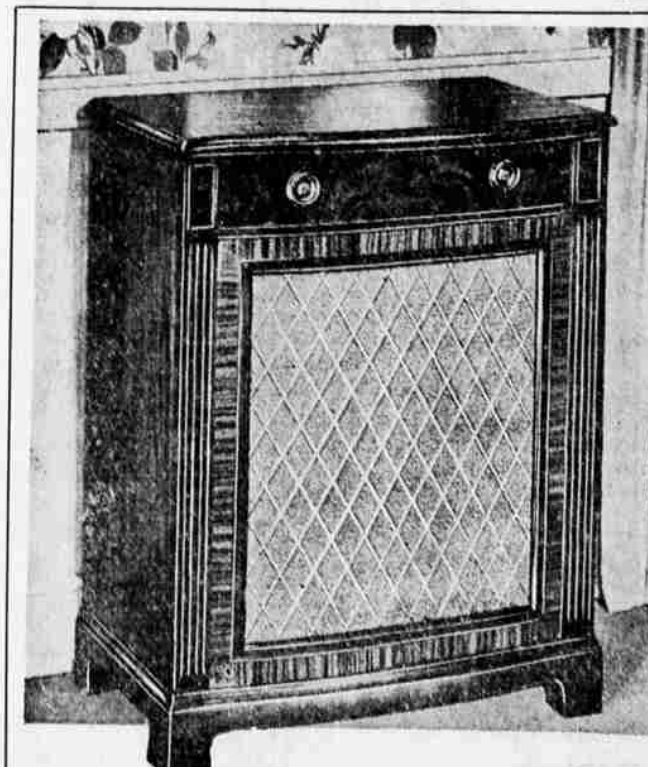
