

Vet Pleads Guilty To Kidnaping

OLYMPIA, Dec. 19 (AP)—A life's imprisonment in the state penitentiary today faced a young army veteran who pleaded guilty yesterday to kidnapping a woman employee of the state tax commission, and told the court he was disillusioned in "returning from service to see the world destroyed before my eyes."

The youth, Thomas P. Bousfield, 23, Glenn Ely, Ill., was sentenced by Superior Judge D. F. Wright after he pleaded guilty to a charge of first degree kidnapping and refused the services of an attorney.

"I'm thoroughly aware of the nature of affairs and the shock I must have caused local citizens," he told the court.

"I couldn't plead not guilty; the act is as repugnant to me as anyone. It is inexplicable."

"I don't know if I have a psychosis or am maladjusted—returning from service to see the world destroyed before my eyes. I guess I couldn't take it, seeing the wealth and luxury."

The young veteran said he was wounded December 7, 1944.

"I say my conduct has not been rational since that time," he added.

Deputy Prosecutor Ralph R. Gilby said the youth abducted Miss Fay Swan, state tax commission employee, at gunpoint December 12 after getting into her car as she left an Olympia restaurant.

She was driven to a deserted spot, held there until midnight and then her abductor took her car and drove to Centralia. After struggling through brush to the highway, Miss Swan notified the state patrol and Bousfield was picked up in Centralia.
