Yule Ship To Leave Soon

SEATTLE, Dec. 19 (AP)—Nearly 20,000 tons of food and clothing to leave the Pacific Northwest soon on the chartered Christmas ship.

The appeal co-chairmen, Howard Parish and Ralph Grossman, made the announcement in Seattle today. The cargo is being donated by residents of Washington, Idaho, Oregon, Montana and Alaska.

Parish and Grossman said they received a telegram from the gifts in kind coordinating committee of the American council of voluntary agencies for foreign service, disclosing where the donations will be sent.

The committee explained that because food donated to the friendship train went to France and Italy, Western Germany and Austria are next in line in point of need.

Sickness Big Veteran Problem

PORTLAND, Dec. 19 (AP)—So many veterans have taken on heavy loads of monthly payments on new homes that sickness would be a calamity, Earl T. Newby, secretary of state, told the Oregon Republican club's county chapter yesterday.

"So far we have not applied the principle of insurance to our problems of health and medical care as we have to most of the other hazards of life," he said. "Once the insurance principle is applied through a system of prepaid medical care to which all will contribute, we should be able to spread the economic burden thin enough so that all can benefit."

Newby said later he was not an exponent of socialized medicine, but advocated the type of prepaid medical care now offered by physicians.

Cold Wave Heading East

Michigan and Northern Minnesota were the nation's coldest spots today with below zero temperatures but the mercury in other parts of the Midwest cold belt was near normal levels.

Colder weather was reported moving into parts of New England, with temperatures of near zero in sections of Northern Maine.

The mercury dropped to 12 below at Cadillac, Mich., for the lowest early morning reading. Minnesota's coldest area was near the Canadian border at International Falls, where the minimum was 16 below. Other sub-zero marks in Michigan included -6 at Pellston and -1 at Sault Ste. Marie.
