The Christmas star is said by some modern scientists to have been a close conjunction of the planets Saturn, Mars and Jupiter.

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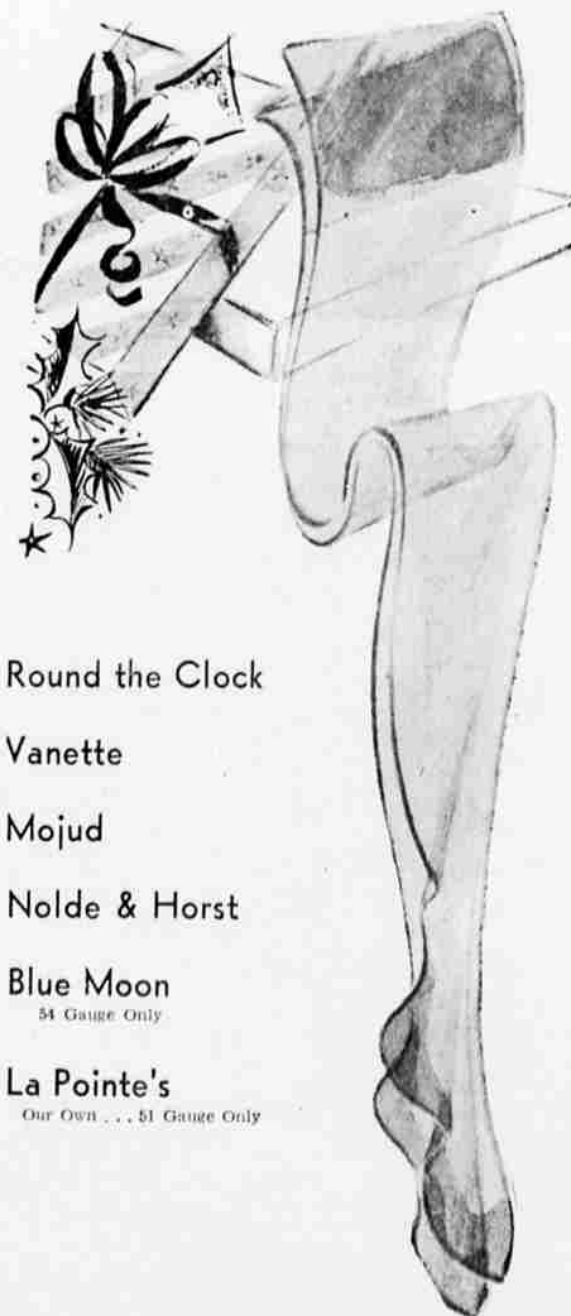
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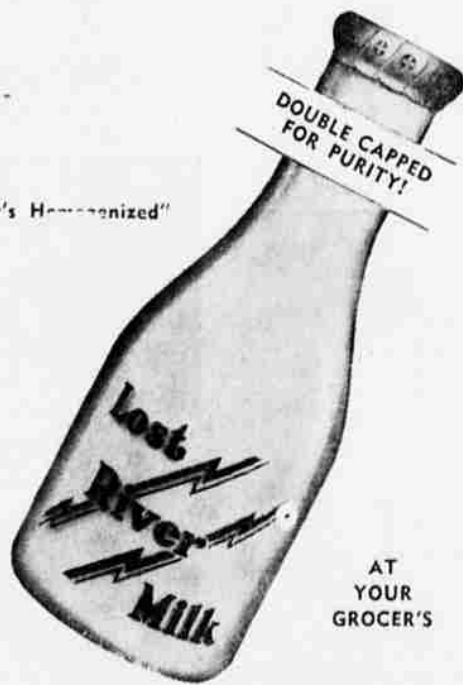
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
