

Castle Speaks On Peace

Ralph Castle, Christian Science lecturer, spoke to members of the local church and friends in a lecture given at the First Christian church Sunday.

The speaker used for his theme the belief that permanent peace must be established for oneself and consequently for all mankind through the understanding of God. "The benediction of the Master, 'Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you,' is for us today, if we will accept it," Castle declared.

This Sunday, "Christian Science" will be the topic of the lesson-sermon at the First Church of Christ, Scientist, 10th and Washington. The Golden Text will be from Isaiah 40:5, "The glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together: for the mouth of the Lord hath spoken it."

Among Bible citations will be, "The kingdom of heaven is like unto leaven, which a woman took, and hid in three measures of meal, till the whole was leavened," (Matt. 13:33).

Sunday school is held at 11 a. m., with the weekly worship service upstairs in the church at the same hour. Weekly meetings are held at 8 p. m., Wednesdays.

Jap Labor Ordered For Housing Work

TOKYO, Dec. 26 (AP)—General MacArthur Friday ordered the Japanese government to see that sufficient labor is provided for work on a local housing project for dependents of occupation personnel.

He said in a directive that the labor shortage was the result of "insufficient distribution of food and clothing rations, lack of transportation, and financial difficulties of contractors due to delay in payments by the Japanese government."

E. K. Jett Quits Post With FCC

WASHINGTON, Dec. 26 (AP)—E. K. Jett, veteran member of the federal communications commission, resigned today, effective December 31.

Jett, a resident of Baltimore who has been with the commission and its predecessor, the federal radio commission, for 19 years, told reporters he will take a job in the private radio field. He said he probably will announce his new position late today.

Jett's resignation leaves two FCC posts vacant. The other formerly held by Charles R. Denny, who also resigned.

No Taxes For Insurance

WASHINGTON, Dec. 26 (AP)—Secretary of the Treasury Snyder said today that nearly all life insurance companies will have no federal taxes to pay on this year's income.

This results, he said in a statement, from a 1942 law which this year brings about the "effective removal of federal income tax liability from insurance companies." Snyder asked that congress give "immediate attention" to changing the law to prevent a repetition of this "unavoidable result."

The treasury secretary explained that the 1942 law fixes a formula for determining what portion of net investment income life insurance companies may deduct from tax liability in order to maintain reserves for the benefit of policy holders.

This year, the formula works out so that the companies may deduct 100.66 per cent of their life insurance investment income, Snyder said.

"I have no alternative (under the law) but to determine such a figure," he added.

Science Office Closed Down

WASHINGTON, Dec. 26 (AP)—The six and a half year old office of scientific research and development (OSRD), was folded up by President Truman today, effective December 31.

He directed the transfer of its personnel and property to the military establishment, which will liquidate it.

Work of the office, which was created by the late President Roosevelt on June 28, 1941, will be taken over by the research and development board set up under the defense unification act. Dr. Vannevar Bush, who headed the OSRD, is chairman of the new board.

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Bum Weather Halts Snow Making Try

ST. PETERSBURG, Fla., Dec. 26 (AP)—Unfavorable weather conditions again forced delay in the St. Petersburg Evening Independent's project to create an artificial snowfall for the holiday season.

Today's weather was a duplicate of conditions Tuesday when out-of-reach cumulus cloud formations caused Bob Leon, former air force pilot, to call off his plan to sprinkle dry ice pellets on clouds and try to produce snow.

Paul Davis, the Independent's managing editor, said Leon would make his snow-producing attempt on any day through January 1 which has the right kind of cloud effects.
