Flames broke out in a new cement-block addition of the Economy Food Lockers, but spared a wooden food locker building 40 feet away.

The addition had 520 lockers, 400 of them filled with food. Flames started in the back of the building from an undetermined source. Prompt action by the fire department saved the wooden building, which had 700 lockers.

Owner Harry Porter, Vancouver, said he had \$50,000 in insurance on the destroyed building.

President Truman's cabinet — he said: "I fight the Truman doctrine and the Marshall plan as applied because they divide Europe into two warring camps. Those whom we buy politically with our food will soon desert us."

Foresees War  
"We are restoring Western Europe and Germany X X X because we want to beat Russia in. We are acting in the same way as France and England after the last war, and the end result will be the same—confusion, depression and war."

"It just doesn't need to happen. The cost of organizing for peace, prosperity and progress is infinitely less than organizing for war."

"We who believe this will be called 'Russian tools and communists.' Let the fear mongers not distort and belittle the issues by name-calling."

"We are not for Russia and we are not for communism but we recognize Hitlerite methods when we see them in our own land and we denounce the men who engage in such name-calling as enemies of a human race who would rather have World War three than put forth a genuine effort to bring about a settlement of differences."

"I insist that the United States will not be fully secure until there is an international police force stronger than the military establishment of any nation, including Russia and the United States."

No Victory For Henry, Says Brother  
ST. PETERSBURG, Fla., Dec. 30 (AP)—His brother predicted today that Henry Wallace "certainly will accomplish something" in his third party bid.

John D. Wallace, real estate and insurance man, didn't forecast presidential election for Henry, however.

"I imagine," John said, "Henry Wallace has figured that was the only way in which he could put over his views and objectives."

Portland Man Takes Own Life  
SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 30 (AP)—Police Lt. Dan McKlem said today that a man who killed himself in a bus depot here Sunday with a pistol had been identified from fingerprints as Thomas Joseph Bailey, 42, who came here from Portland.

Lieutenant McKlem said police had been looking for Bailey for six months and that he was one of three men accused of at least six big department store holdups in Portland, including the \$36,000 Lipman Wolfe & Co. robbery.

may point up that controversial question as an issue.

Calling for volunteers to support his venture, Wallace told his radio audience: "A new party must stand for a positive youth program of abundance and security, not scarcity and war. We can prevent depression and war if we only organize for peace in the same comprehensive way we organize for war."

He said the democratic party has refused to change its policy and asserted that its leadership will "deprive the American people of their rightful opportunity to choose between progress and reaction in 1948."

"So far as the republican party is concerned," Wallace said, "there is no hope—as George Norris, Fiorello LaGuardia and Wendell Willkie long ago found out."

Despite public statements discounting the effect of Wallace's move, there was ample evidence the democrats fear its possible effect in such key states as New York, California, Washington, Illinois and Michigan.

## Red Planes Over Japan

WASHINGTON, Dec. 30 (AP)—Russian aircraft were reported Monday to have flown over American occupied Japan and Korea numerous times without prior authorization during the past months.

Diplomatic officials disclosed this to a reporter today in commenting on a Russian protest to the state department against alleged American flights over the Soviet-held Kurile islands off Japan.

These government officials described the Russian note as one of many received monthly by the state department about such matters. These notes are considered so insignificant, they said, they are referred to American commanders on the spot for possible action.

The Russian planes which these officials said flew illegally over American territory in the Far East included transport planes which veered from the course assigned them in their regular flights from Siberia to Tokyo. These flights are allowed by General MacArthur's headquarters because the Russians say they need them to service and supply their staff in the Japanese capital.

Nineteen Die In Plane Crash  
KARACHI, Pakistan, Dec. 30 (AP)—Nineteen passengers, including an Irish Jesuit priest, and crew members were killed when an Indian transport plane crashed Saturday night shortly after taking off from Karachi to Bombay.

The priest, Father J. G. Sloan, belonged to the Patna mission in India, where he had been for eight years. He had arrived Saturday in Karachi from Bahrain, on the Persian gulf, and was en route to Ceylon on a preaching mission.
