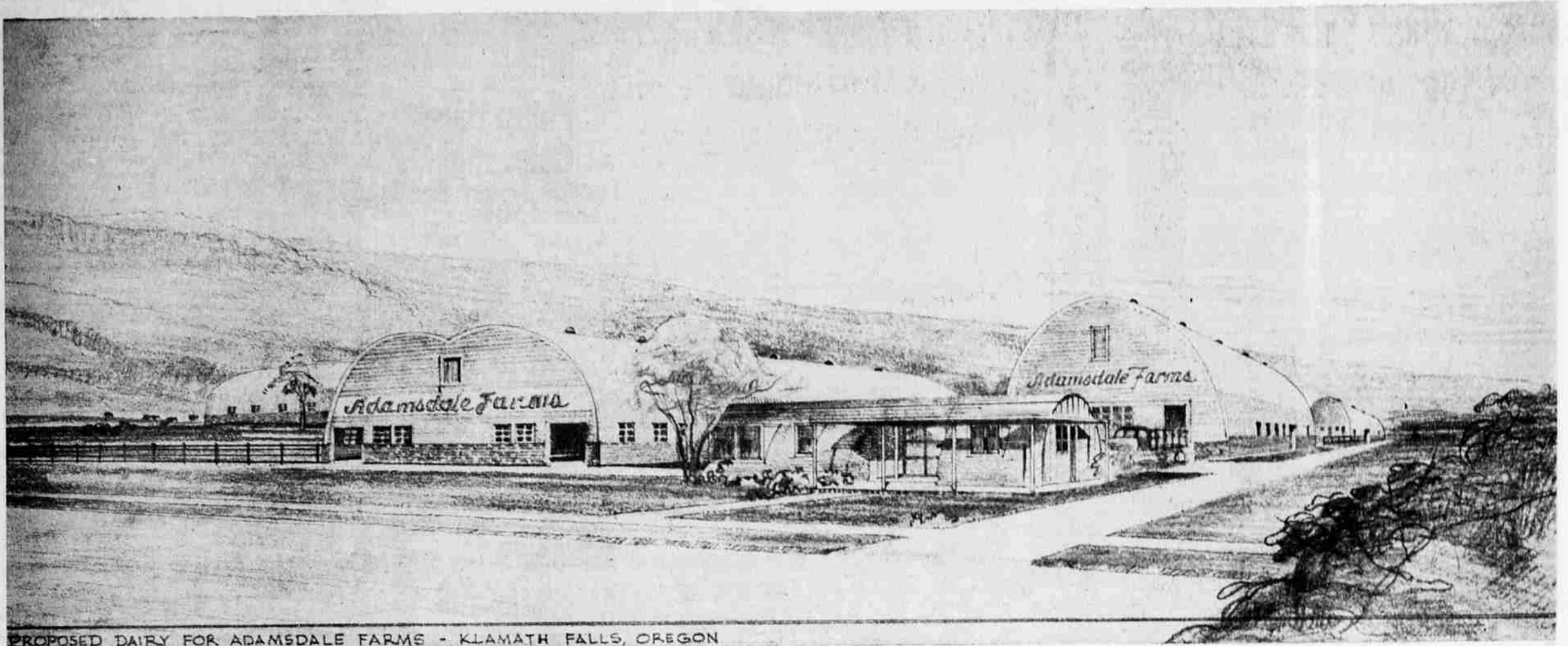

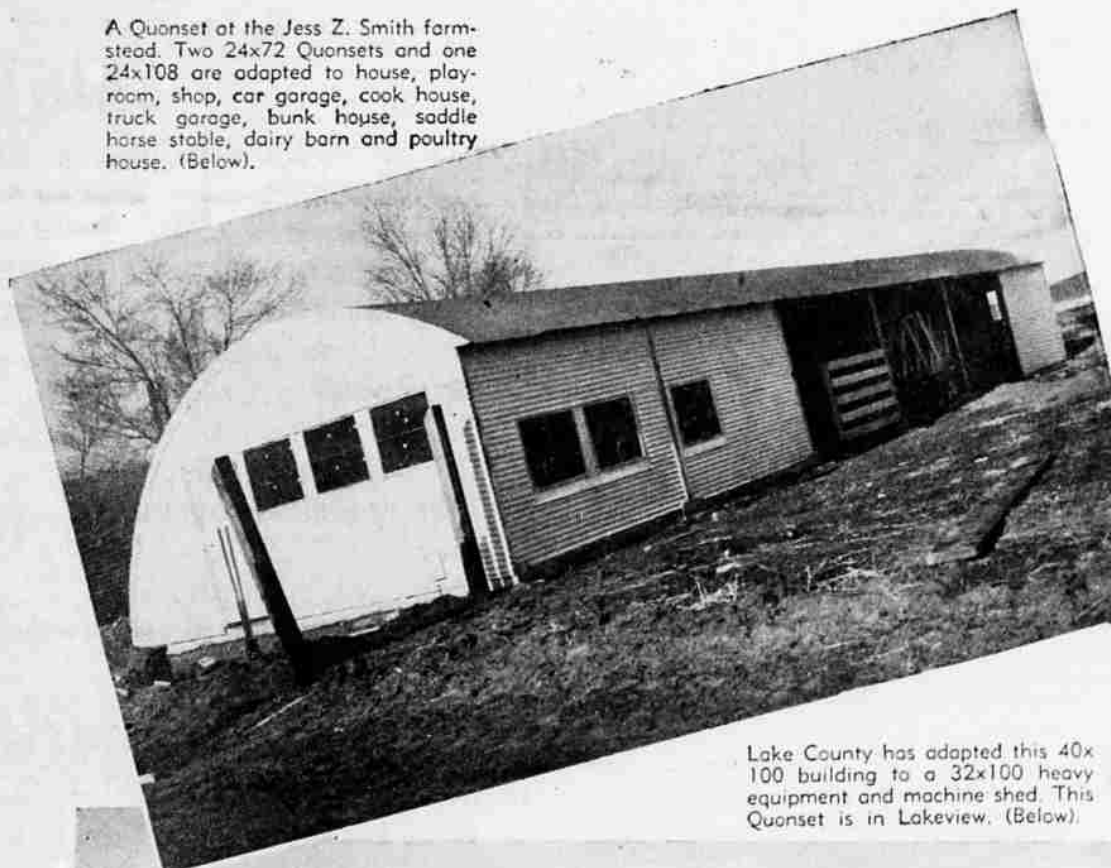
PROPOSED DAIRY FOR ADAMSDALE FARMS - KLAMATH FALLS, OREGON

Kandra-Noggle Artist's Conception of Planned Quonset Steel Building Arrangement for Adamsdale Farms

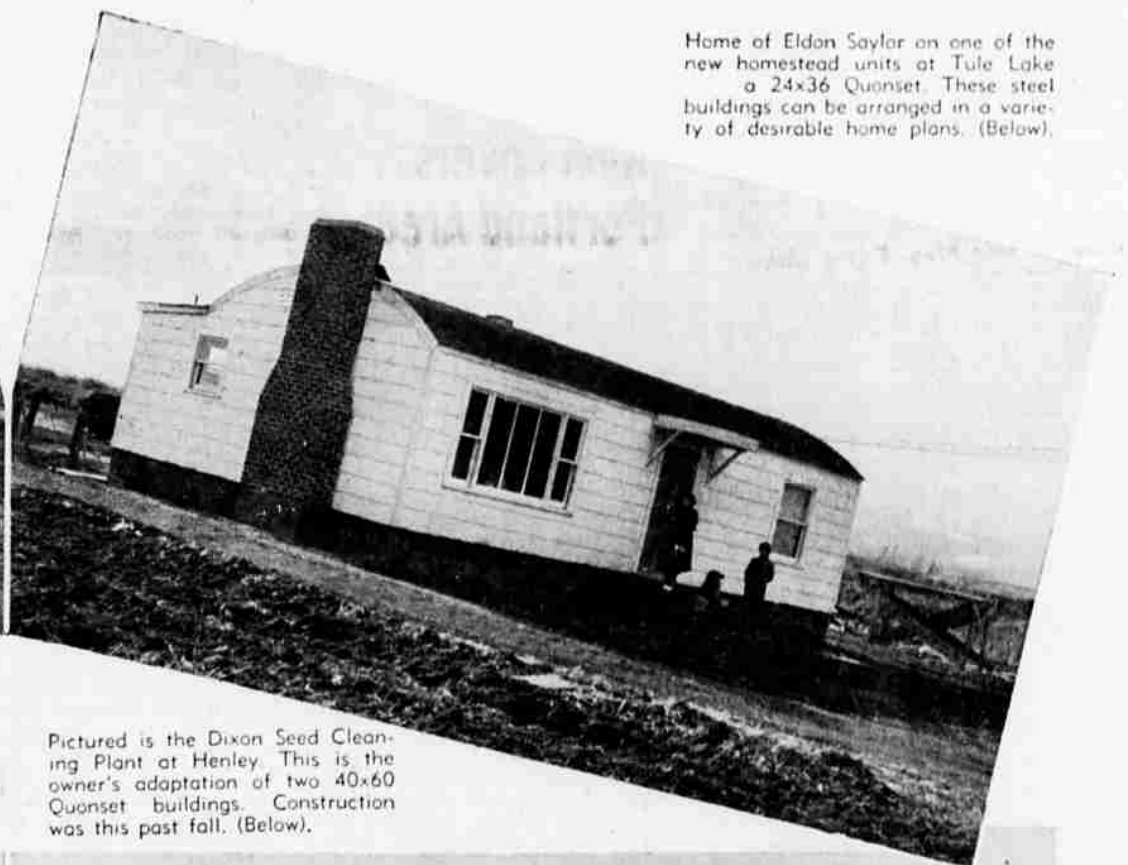
Since Kandra-Noggle opened the Quonset agency March, 1947, the steel buildings have been successfully adapted to such uses as warehousing, dairy barns, potato cellars, housing, grain storage, laundry, department stores, markets, machine sheds, service stations, restaurants, theatres, drug stores, garages and others.

Quonset buildings are in stock at all times, in widths of 20 ft., 24 ft., 36 ft., 40 ft., 60 ft. and 100 ft.—any length, straight or curved walls. Multiples of 20 feet are available to any width. Artists' conceptions and plans are furnished with the buildings by Kandra-Noggle. Below are some buildings put up the past year.

A Quonset at the Jess Z. Smith farmstead. Two 24x72 Quonsets and one 24x108 are adapted to house, playroom, shop, car garage, cook house, truck garage, bunk house, saddle horse stable, dairy barn and poultry house. (Below).

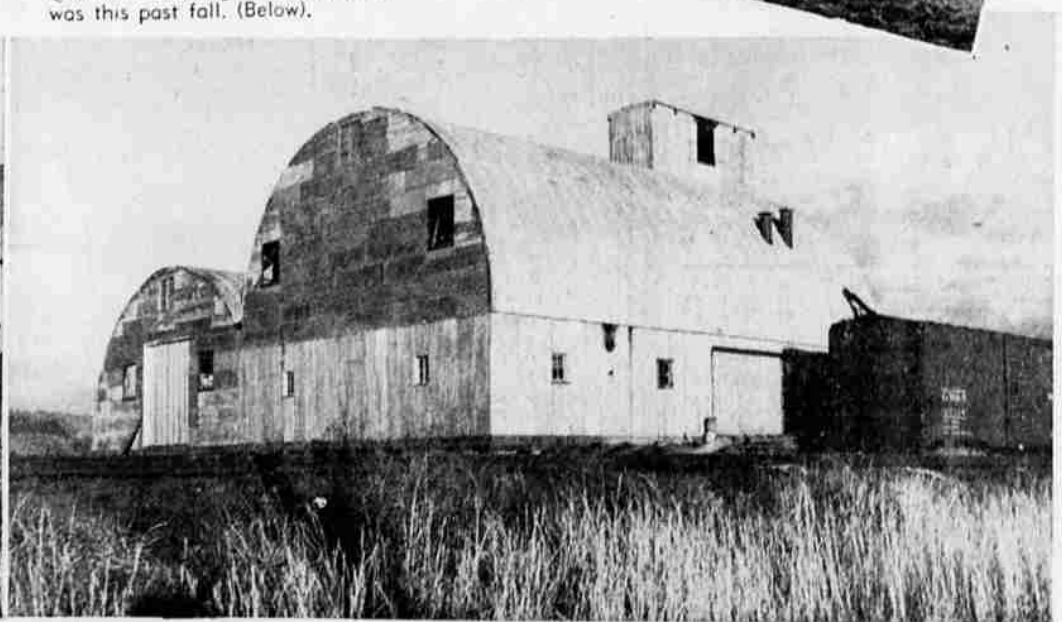
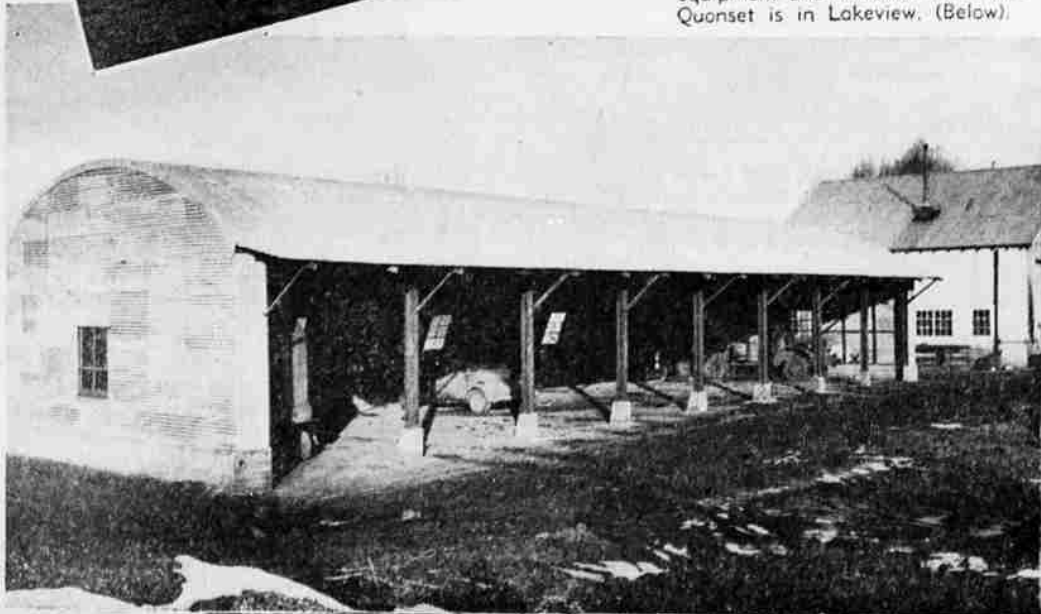
