

Klamath Insurance Men To Meet

Life insurance underwriters from throughout the Klamath Falls area will gather at the Winema hotel, Saturday, January 10, for an all-day trust functions conference sponsored by the United States National bank, E. H. Thompson, manager of the Klamath Falls branch, has announced.

A team of trust experts from the Portland office of the bank, headed by R. M. Alton, vice president and trust officer, will lead the program, which is to be a condensed version of the same conference that recently drew over 300 life underwriters in the Portland area to a series of evening meetings in that city.

According to Thompson, who will preside over the morning session, the conference is designed to familiarize the life underwriters in the Klamath Falls area with current trust methods and policies, so that the trust officers and the insurance underwriters may function more closely for the public welfare.

Carl Walker, president of the Life Underwriters Association of the Klamath basin, is scheduled to speak briefly. Other officers of the association will be introduced at that time.

R. M. Alton, president of the trust division of the American Bankers association, as well as head of the trust department of Oregon's largest banking institution, will open the session with a discussion of the life underwriter and trust officer team.

He is to be followed by Trust Officer W. D. Hinson, who will tell of the part life insurance plays in estate planning, and Trust Officer L. B. Staver, who will discuss business insurance trusts.

Oscar Shive, assistant manager of the United States National bank's Klamath branch will preside at the afternoon session. Assistant Vice President E. J. Overman of Portland will lead off the second half with a discussion of the problems to be confronted in investing trust funds under present-day conditions.

Next, D. W. MacKay, trust officer, will outline the complexities of Oregon's community property law. The conference will conclude with a discussion of taxes in relation to the community property law, by H. W. Moss, assistant trust officer.

The recent trust functions conference held in Portland, from which the Klamath Falls program is an outgrowth, was the first to be held since before the war.

The program was so enthusiastically received by the Portland underwriters that the United States National bank arranged to send the original group of speakers to the larger cities throughout the state for a one-day presentation in each locality. The program was held last month in Medford and Eugene and this month will be held in Klamath Falls and Salem.

Originally planned as a biennial program, the conference will be sponsored by the United States National bank of Portland, as often as changes in the laws and the current practices dictate, according to E. H. Thompson, manager of the Klamath Falls branch.

CIO Maps Plan For Wage Boost

DETROIT, Jan. 7 (AP)—The CIO United Auto Workers began charting their course today on a demand for a third postwar wage boost for 900,000 factory employees.

The exact goal was still to be determined, but the decision was believed only a matter of days distant. A number of influential UAW locals have proposed 25 cents an hour.

President Walter Reuther, in announcing the UAW's intent to seek bigger pay checks in 1948 rather than count on a price rollback, said his union would "demand and win" a raise as a "forced necessity."

63 Students Enroll For OVS Classes

Sixty-three new students were enrolled this week in the Oregon Vocational school, bringing the total of enrollment up to 333 for the new school in the former plant of the Marine Barracks.

More newcomers are arriving and inquiries mounting. Two new classes were started, in watch and clock-making and in medical technology. The former class was filled immediately and a waiting list established.

The school now has 25 classes in operation, with 29 instructors. There have been no graduates yet, but there will be graduations on an individual basis in about a month. Classes now in operation include: Cooks—2. Refrigeration service—6. Auto body and fender—8. Diesel mechanics—6. Bakery—2. Commercial art—1. Draftsmanship—1. Dressmaking—1. Dry cleaning—1. 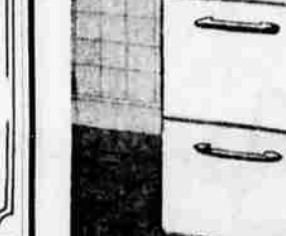
