A half-scale working model of a big transport truck was placed on display in the Balinger Motor company showroom this afternoon by the Pacific Intermountain Express company.

The model is fully equipped with dual drive, air brakes, auxiliary transmission, and other features. It has a 60 horsepower Willys jeep gas engine, whereas the full-scale equipment is powered by a 200-horsepower Cummins diesel.

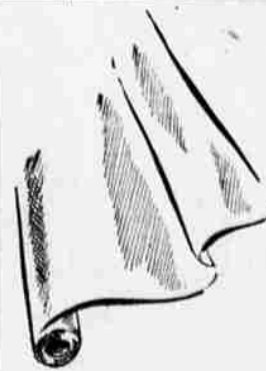

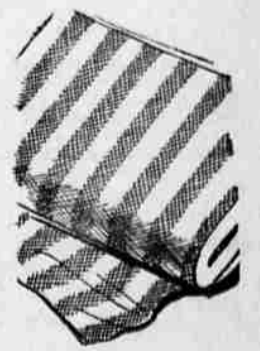
