

Three Weeks Being Sliced Off Fishing Tentative Rules Expected To Bring Protests Locally

A May 1 to September 30 trout season, with a minimum trout length of six inches, is in prospect for Oregon this year.

Tentative season for steelhead, salmon and jack salmon would be May 1, 1948 to March 1, 1949.

EARLIER CLOSING In 1947 the general trout season ran from April 26 to October 15, so the May 1-September 30 dates would take a week off the front of the season, two weeks off the end.

NCAA Writes Sanity Code Into Records

NEW YORK, Jan. 12 (AP)—The "sanity code" has been written into the books but there were questions today about how far the National Collegiate Athletic Association's new principles of conduct will go in eliminating subsidization of athletes.

The set of amendments, as adopted by the some 400 major colleges and universities of the NCAA Saturday, strikes mainly at wholesale recruiting practices.

1. Financial aid may be granted to athletes only on the basis of need and scholarship qualifications for which any student is eligible and only by regular agencies set up by the institution.

PORTLAND, Jan. 12 (AP)—The state racing commission was to consider three applications for racing tracks today, and it had a new problem: It can't set specific dates for the tracks.

That was the opinion given by Attorney-General George Neuner and Deputy Attorney-General Rex Kimmel. They said the 1947 amendment to the racing law authorizes licensees to hold racing meets any time between May 1 and November 1, provided they do not conflict with state or county fairs.

Beavers Lead Northern Cage After Openers

California Bears Stand Alone With Southern Top Spot

By The Associated Press Idaho's Vandals, unimpressive in pre-season contests, tackle their first northern division Pacific Coast conference basketball foe tonight—and they pick a toughie.

The Idahoans and their new coach, Chuck Finley, draw the Oregon State college Beavers, defending coast and division titles, who bring a double defeat on highly touted Washington State in a week-end series.

The Beavers held Washington State to a total of 71 points in its two contests, winning Saturday by the low score of 43-38, to indicate that Coach Slaty Gill has knitted together a tight defensive quintet.

Norm Carey and Ken Storey of the victors and WSC's Ed Gavia all hit 10 points for individual honors.

The OSC-Idaho meetings tonight and tomorrow occupy the entire division stage.

Washington, which split with Oregon at Eugene, entertains Washington State this Friday and Saturday while Oregon and Oregon State meet in the first of their four solo games at Corvallis this Friday.

Washington's Huskies, who came from behind Friday to nip the Oregon Ducks, never could fashion a consistent offensive threat Saturday and fell 73-58 victims. After four ties in the first five minutes, Oregon moved ahead on a shot by Center Roger Wiley and was never caught.

Jack Nichols, Washington center, and Al Popick, Oregon guard, each hit 19 points.

The University of California stood alone at the head of the Pacific Coast conference (southern division) basketball standings today.

The Golden Bears won their second game in as many starts Saturday night by downing Southern California, 53-40, and in so doing saw their ace forward, Chuck Hanger, forge to the front in the individual scoring race with 27 points through the cords and establish a new school record. Teammate Andy Wolfe, who contributed 8 in the Trojan rout, formerly held the high mark of 23.

In the other half of the twin bill, Forward John Stanich led UCLA to a 55-47 decision over Stanford. The victory put the Bruins in a second-place tie with the Trojans, each with one win and one loss, while the defeat was the second straight for the cellar-dwelling Indians.

NEW YORK, Jan. 12 (AP)—The withering fire of intensified competition is expected to cut deeper this week into the slender ranks of unbeaten college basketball teams—already reduced to 11.

One of the perfect teams is bound to fall since a pair of them are matched in the week's top cage attraction—North Carolina against New York university at Madison Square Garden Thursday.

The southern conference power, which has won 11 straight, and the metropolitan club, victorious in nine appearances, tangle on a program that also sends St. Johns' against De Paul.

Both NYU and North Carolina have engagements earlier in the week, however, but are figured to prevail and come up to their clash with spotless, exultant NYU plays Cornell Tuesday. North Carolina takes on Wake Forest tonight.

Other unbeaten teams are: Duquesne (10), Georgia (10), Columbia (9), LaSalle of Philadelphia (9), Iowa (8), Clarkson Tech (7), Rhode Island State (6), Ronaok College (6), and Salem, W. Va. (6).

Five teams were beaten for the first time Saturday—St. Louis, downed by Oklahoma A and M, 7-30; Providence, downed by Boston College, 62-43; Cortland State, humbled by Hartwick, 67-61; Navy, beaten by Villanova, 61-39, and Army, licked by Pittsburgh, 42-41.

Here is the sectional basketball picture at a glance: Big Nine—Iowa's eight straight victories the best overall record but Wisconsin leading the conference with three wins to two for Iowa.

Ivy League—Columbia the power-house with 12-1 and George Washington 11-1 setting the pace for season's play.

Pacific Coast—California (2-0) leading the southern division and Oregon State (2-0) setting the pace for the northern group.

Mountain States—Utah State and Denver sharing the lead in the "Skyline Six" with the favored Utah a disappointment so far.
