

Jew Plane Fires On British Ship

JERUSALEM, Jan. 15 (AP)—A plane which British military officials said they believed was Jewish-piloted fired on an RAF reconnaissance craft today over Kfar Etzion in the mountain area south of Jerusalem, where Jews and Arabs had been locked in a bloody 24-hour battle.

British planes, along with tanks and artillery, had been moved into the area to halt the fighting, in which 50 persons were reported to have been slain.

The pilot of the reconnaissance plane reported the Jewish plane dipped down over a cluster of Jewish settlements and dropped a message. The reconnaissance plane followed it down and was fired on, but did not return the fire, the report said.

First Air Battle

It was the first time the British had met any aerial opposition since the outbreak of hostilities over partition of the Holy Land.

In the vicinity of Hebron Arabs numbering about 400 surrounded four Jewish settlements. A Jewish agency spokesman said the fighting

stopped when the British moved in, but criticized what he called "the failure of the British security forces to intercede in the Hebron area fighting until 24 hours after it started."

Stammary fighting paralyzed the port city of Haifa, where at least 11 persons—seven Arabs and four Jews—died in a series of gunfights, grenadeings and stabbings during the morning. Some 25 Arabs and 12 Jews were wounded.

Five Held In Dynamite Case

NEW YORK, Jan. 15 (AP)—Accused of violating federal law in connection with attempted shipments of explosives to Palestine, five men were free in bail of \$1000 each today and FBI agents pressed search for five other suspects.

The five defendants, arraigned late yesterday before U. S. District Judge William Bondy, are awaiting federal grand jury action on charges of making false export declarations. The maximum penalty is 10 years imprisonment and \$1000 fine.

Broadcast: January 17, 1948

Mix together 1/2 cup sugar, flour and salt. Stir in slowly mixture of milk and water. Cook and stir over boiling water 10 min. after water again boils. Stir slowly into slightly beaten egg yolks. Cook and stir 2 min. Cool. Mix crumbs with 1 tablesp. sugar and melted butter. Save 1/2 cup crumb mixture; press remaining crumbs on bottom and sides of well-buttered 6-in. square pan. Put custard into pan. Top with pineapple. Beat egg whites stiff but not dry. Beat in remaining 1/4 cup sugar slowly. Spread on pineapple. Sprinkle reserved crumbs over top. Bake in slow oven (325° F.) 20 min., or until light brown. Makes 4 servings. *Vanilla wafer crumbs also can be used.
