

# Meter Fund All Spent On Traffic

Many a motorist, when he pokes a penny in a parking meter, wonders exactly what is to be the fate of his coin after it goes in the meter slot. What happens to the estimated \$49,000 in nickels and pennies put into the city's meters by Klamath motorists is told in the 1947-48 police budget pinning it down to the last cent.

Half of the \$49,000 total goes to payment due to the Mark-Time Parking Meter company, with the other \$24,428 kept by the city. At this rate, \$43,055.50 (purchase price of the meters), should be paid off within another year.

The city's part of the revenue may, by ordinance, be spent for any purpose connected with traffic.

Salaries take up the greater part of the city's \$24,428 with \$15,840 used to pay a traffic sergeant, two traffic officers, a part-time clerk who takes care of filing work on overtime parking tickets, a collector-maintenance man, and a painter, hired for six months. The painter takes care of repainting crosswalks and other street painting jobs.

The rest of the money is spent this way:

# Fertilizer Orders Grow

Klamath basin potato fertilizer orders are 40 per cent filled or in the process of being shipped, A. L. Perry of Pacific Guano Fertilizer said at Monday's annual meeting of Klamath Potato Growers association.

Perry anticipates enough fertilizer to see potato growers through 1948 planting. Pacific Guano is producing short supplies of 16-20-0 and filling out balance of orders with Klamath Special (10-16-8).

U. S. fertilizer commitments for shipment abroad are quite high again this year. Some increase in production is expected but consists largely of liquid fertilizers.

Shipments of Hi Crop (10-10-5) which Pacific Guano refers to as grain fertilizer will start after potato fertilizer orders have been filled.

John O'Neil of Merrill is handling distribution of Pacific Guano fertilizer in this area.

# Government Course Set

A nation-wide YMCA program to teach high school students the fundamentals of government through actual practice will be instituted in Oregon this year.

Under the program, students representing between 75 and 100 Hi-Y's and Tri-Hi-Y's throughout the state will be elected to a model boy and girl legislature which will convene in Salem in April. Dr. U. G. Dubach of Lewis and Clark college and layman in charge of the program, announced today.

The young legislators will select their own state officers, beginning with the governor, under the system which is known nationally as the YMCA youth and government program.

The legislature will debate and act upon actual bills dropped in the hopper by the model legislators. The bills will be prepared after a public opinion poll has been taken by the students, Dubach declared.

Dubach pointed out that in other

states—some of which have had this program for over a decade—bills proposed by boy legislators and passed by the model legislature have been made the law of the state in sessions of regular legislature.

The program is completely non-partisan. Advisors to the high school students have been selected from both the democratic and republican parties here and included Clayton Burrell of Klamath Falls.

# Death Rate Stays Same

Some interesting facts on the birth and death figures for Klamath county for the last three years were announced today by Dr. Seth M. Kerron, county health physician.

The death figures show that there has been no radical change upward or downward during the

last three years. There were 306 deaths in the county in 1945, 307 in 1946, and 306 again in 1947.

Births however have increased each year in this county with 1947 recorded in 1945, 1229 in 1946, and 1348 in 1947.

Of the deaths in 1947, 35 were children under 1 year of age, showing an infant death rate of 2.6. This is practically the same average as that for the state. A good percentage of these infants were premature births, Dr. Kerron said. With proper care this figure could be greatly reduced, he said, if wom-

en would consult their own physicians soon enough and often enough and follow his advice.
