

Liquidation Battle To Be Pushed

Wade Crawford, leader of the Klamath Indian group which favors a reservation liquidation bill, S. 1222, left today for Washington, D. C. to work for passage of the bill.

Crawford said he is going to the capital as president and representative of the Klamath-Lake Progressive league, made up of both Indians and whites, which favors the bill. He said he will stay in Washington only long enough to work for the measure, probably not more than 30 days.

Before leaving, Crawford issued the following statement outlining his position:

"We will right the wrongs that have been done the Klamath Indians." Those are the words of Senator Gordon in August, 1947, when the senate subcommittee on Indian affairs visited here.

I am going to Washington to find out if those words are to be put into effect, or will they pass into history, another broken promise.

The administration of the Klamath Indian property, by the bureau of Indian affairs, in many cases has been permitted, by the congress of the United States, which enacts the laws under which the Indians must live. Through politics and maladministration the Klamath Indians have sustained millions of dollars in losses.

From the record I will quote concrete examples:

(a) \$7,000,000 in beetle-killed timber between the years 1913 and 1945.

(b) Contracts which "guaranteed" the lumber companies a substantial margin of profit.

(c) One company holding two or three contracts, operating in one, in the cutting season, and applying ALL cutting requirements, on all contracts, to the one unit operated in. This policy is continuing.

Between 1913 and 1934 inclusive, a volume of 2,142,546,148 B.M. was removed.

An example of the "guaranteed" profit, is the profit and loss sheet of the Forest Lumber company for the year 1927. This sheet shows that the Indian timber paid for plant and railroad investment in the amount of \$2,015,922.92. The taxes charged against loss amounted to \$13,669.52. Their balance sheets for 1927 show that profit and loss balanced gain and as they were "guaranteed" a profit, the company was not required to pay the increased price in stumpage stipulated in the contract.

Twenty contracts, for a period of 20 years, operated on the same basis. In 1934 all contracts but one were modified. Some were defunct, the bond had expired and the cutting requirements had never been lived up to. The price was reduced from \$7 and \$8 dollars to \$4.00, with the Indians taking the loss. The companies were permitted to modify the defunct contracts.

In 1913 there were approximately 6,000,000,000 feet of ponderosa pine. At this writing there is left about 700,000,000 feet of virgin stand. The average price of pine realized between 1913 and 1946 is \$4.74. The fictitious paper values written into the contracts have never materialized in cash. The Klamath Indians took a beating during the war as the price of pine received by the O. & C. will prove.

Ewauna holds three contracts: Saddle mountain at \$8.20; Calmus marsh at \$10.75; and Little Yamsay at \$20.51. During the current cutting season, Ewauna cut the minimum amount on Saddle mountain and Calmus, at the advantageous price of \$8.20. The contract permits this, but it is bad forestry practice and disadvantageous to the Indians.

In the case of the Little Yamsay unit, the Indian bureau put over a fast deal this summer. The tabbed resolution on the Little Yamsay was never taken from the table on a two-thirds parliamentary procedure. Instead, I quote from the record of the council as of September 9, 1947:

The Doctor Says—

Smallpox Caution Needed

In February, 1947, a 47-year-old merchant, who had lived in Mexico for six years, began a bus trip from Mexico to New York City. This man was apparently well when he left Mexico City, but by evening he had a headache and pain in the back of his neck.

Two days later, while still traveling by bus, he developed a rash, but continued his journey and reached a hotel in New York six days after leaving Mexico City. After being in New York four more days, he entered the hospital and, on March 10, he died.

The disease which caused death was smallpox. During the time he was ill, he spread the disease to a 27-year-old man and to the latter's two children. The second man infected his wife, who died, and four others. One of the children infected by the traveler passed the disease on to two more children and to a nun outside of New York City.

As soon as the nature of the illness was realized, vigilant health officials went into action. Mayor William O'Dwyer issued appeals asking everyone to be vaccinated. The response was magnificent; five million were vaccinated in New York City within two weeks and more than six million in less than a month. Never before had so many people in one city been vaccinated so quickly.

The fact that vaccination was so quick.

complicated so rapidly meant that there were few people left in the city still susceptible to smallpox. If mass vaccination had not been done, many residents of the city would have been susceptible.

400 DIED IN 1901

In other cases, the accidental introduction of a victim of smallpox into a city has not resulted in such a fortunate outcome. In New York City itself, for example, an epidemic of smallpox occurred in 1901 in which there were nearly 2000 cases and over 400 deaths. If the same thing had happened in the recent outbreak, there would have been more than 4000 cases and nearly 1000 deaths, instead of the 12 cases and two deaths which actually occurred.

Although smallpox can be stopped in its tracks, it is still a dangerous condition. It is far from safe to relax our efforts to keep people protected by vaccination.

Plans For Hall Delayed

Plans for construction of a community hall by the Suburban League have been delayed until spring and until the fire station in the south suburban district is completed.

Chairman Arthur Carlson of the California republican assembly, unofficially but influential party organization, proclaimed 1948 "the golden year of opportunity for the republican party."

The assembly formally endorsed Warren for the nomination Saturday. He announced his candidacy last year but said he would not seek support in other states.
