

Basin Area Barley Seed Held Good

Tagging of Klamath county certified Hannechen barley seed is dependent on purity and germination tests of samples taken after cleaning. Production of acreage passing 1947 field inspection is eligible for tags if identity of seed has been maintained and results of tests show 90% purity, less than 5% other crop seed, less than 2% weed seed, not over 45% wild oats per pound, and at least 90% germination.

With proper cleaning Klamath county lots are expected to be considerably better than minimum requirements. Field inspection reports show very little mixture of other grains or barley varieties.

There is opportunity for production of Foundation barley seed in this area. Clean potato land is suitable. Field inspection requirements for foundation barley permit no mixtures of other grain or other barley. Purity tests after cleaning must show 90% purity, not over 2% other crops, no wild oats, no other weed seeds and at least 90% germination.

No foundation barley was grown in Klamath in 1947. But 1400 acres of Hannechen passed inspection and certified seed. A list of growers and acreage can be obtained at the county agent's office. A large part of the crop from certified fields was sold for brewing purposes. Probably not over 30,000 sacks remain available for seed purposes.

Oregon's field day at the Oceanside potato seed test plots has been postponed one week to February 5.

Tips On Serving Frozen Foods In Your Home

For the garden color and flavor of summer foods in January, you can take your choice of fruits, vegetables and meats frozen at the peak of their perfection.

A short summary of preparation methods of frozen foods is a helpful guide:

Fruits

Serve very cold while they still have a few ice crystals in them. This insures a firmer texture and more appetizing quality than does completely thawed, lukewarm fruit.

Vegetables

Corn on cob and solid masses of greens are thawed before cooking. Other vegetables are cooked while still frozen in small amount of boiling water or by steaming. Cook them all shortest time that yields the texture which your family will accept. This is about one-half to two-thirds the time for fresh vegetables. Flavor, food value and good texture decrease with long cooking.

Meats

Cook frozen or thawed. If frozen, allow extra time in cooking for thawing. Use low cooking temperature for a long period. Slow, long cooking produces more uniform doneness, greater tenderness and juiciness and less shrinkage and losses. Use dry heat for tender cuts and moist heat for less tender cuts.

Frozen foods do not need washing as they are cleaned before freezing. Washing would dissolve flavors and nutrients.

Keeping Qualities

Freezing retards rather than destroys microorganisms. The product that has been preserved by freezing spoils even more rapidly when thawed than is the case with a fresh product. To prevent waste due to food spoiling, a good general plan is to keep the products frozen until used, as far as possible.

How To Thaw

Frozen fruits should be served very cold for sauce, while they still have a few ice crystals in them, and never over 60 degrees F. Lukewarm, thawed fruit has a tendency to slump and grow soft in texture.

Fruit which is still very cold is more firm and more appetizing.

Thaw fruits in their original container. Invert occasionally to distribute the juice. This aids the juice in going back into the product as it thaws. The thawing may take place in the refrigerator, at room temperature, or in warm water. The slower method in the refrigerator

gives a more uniform product. If fruit is to be cooked, it need not be thawed more than enough to remove it from the container.
