

Forest Work Report Due

Getting reports on 1947 work up-to-date is occupying the staff of the U. S. forestry office, post office building, these winter days.

Bob Lavengood, forester with the Rogue River national forest, stationed at Union Creek, is in the Klamath Falls office this week working up the annual progress report on the Finney logging sale at Rocky Point.

Data is kept from year to year on all timber sales for reference, so that management practices, good or bad, may be continued or avoided in future sales in similar conditions.

The other men in the office, John Ferguson, district ranger, Ansl Pearce, forester, and Charles Sullaway, clerk, are completing other data, including working up the accumulated sales record for the area. They are preparing a map showing cutover areas on the forest, the year the cutting was done, the individual who did the logging when the slash was disposed of or equivalent treatment. Colors are used on the map with a legend explaining their designation.

VA Changes Rule In Farm Training

WASHINGTON, Jan. 22 (AP)—The veterans administration opened its farm management training program today to two-man farm partnerships.

Hitherto, the program has been limited to one war veteran per farm, the veteran being the owner or having economic control of the farm.

Because of this limitation, brothers who lived on the same farm have had to divide the property if they wished to take GI bill on-farm training which combines classroom instruction with practical farming.

Police Search Holdup Trio

PENDLETON, Jan. 22 (AP)—Police today were hunting for three teen age boys who wounded an elderly gasoline station owner at Athena in a holdup at 9 o'clock last night and fled with \$80 cash.

A. J. Queener, station owner, is in a hospital with a head wound from the slashing shot. He was not considered critically wounded.

State police said partial descriptions of the boys were obtained, but that it was not known for certain whether they fled in an automobile that might have been parked nearby.

Zionist Leader Asks Jew Arms

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 22 (AP)—A world Zionist leader says recently seized explosives should be released to Jews in Palestine who "are being left to fight empty handed while their Arab enemies are being well equipped by neighboring Moslem states."

Meir Grossman of Tel Aviv, vice president of the actions committee of the World Zionist organization, referred to arms uncovered in New Jersey, Pennsylvania and New York and declared:

"Technically, the authorities are right in seizing the arms, but they are morally wrong in withholding them. The Jews are only fighting

to carry out the will of the United Nations. If the partition decision is not to be enforced by the United Nations, it is the duty of Jews everywhere to fight for it themselves."

SOUR CREAM APPLE TORTE

by Martha Meade

Tart sour cream apple custard in flaky pastry brings old world enchantment to your table.

Sift flour before measuring. Use level measurements for all ingredients.

Place in a saucepan —

- 3 cups thinly sliced peeled apples
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar

Cover and cook slowly, stirring occasionally, until apples are tender, about 15 minutes. Then stir in —

- 1/2 cup whole egg, beaten (2 large)

Continue cooking slowly, uncovered, until mixture thickens, about 5 minutes. Remove from heat and blend in —

- 1 tablespoon vanilla extract
- 1/2 teaspoon grated lemon rind
- 1/2 teaspoon powdered nutmeg

Four filling into pastry lined casserole and sprinkle lightly with nutmeg. Bake in a preheated hot oven, 425°, for 20 minutes. To serve, cut into squares and garnish with sweetened whipped cream, if desired. Serve warm or cold, 6 servings.

*Note: Either sour pastry or table cream may be used. Lemon juice in the egg mixture then fill it with cream. Let the mixture stand 10 minutes before using.

PASTRY

- 1/2 cup shortening
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 3 tablespoons cold water

Blend ingredients together with a fork until shortening is creamy and absorbs part of water. Then add all at once —

MAKE BUTTER GO ALMOST TWICE AS FAR

with **Mary Lee Taylor's PET BUTTER SPREAD**

Broadcast: January 24, 1948
1/2 lb. butter or margarine
1/4 teaspoon salt 1/4 cup Pet Milk

Cut butter in small pieces. Put in mixing bowl. Let stand in warm room until soft enough to stir with a spoon—as easily as mayonnaise (see note). Let milk stand in warm room also. Butter and milk will blend better if they are the same temperature. Stir milk into soft butter gradually, adding 2 tablespoons at a time using mixing spoon, rotary egg beater or electric beater at low speed. When all milk is added, beat vigorously 1 minute to blend completely. Cover bowl and chill, or pack while soft into straight-sided dish. Keep chilled when not in use. Serve as spread on bread, pancakes, waffles, biscuits, muffins, etc. Makes a little less than 2 cups (1 lb.).

NOTE: If kitchen or weather is cool, place bowl containing butter in large bowl or pan half filled with hot water, stirring butter as it softens.
